

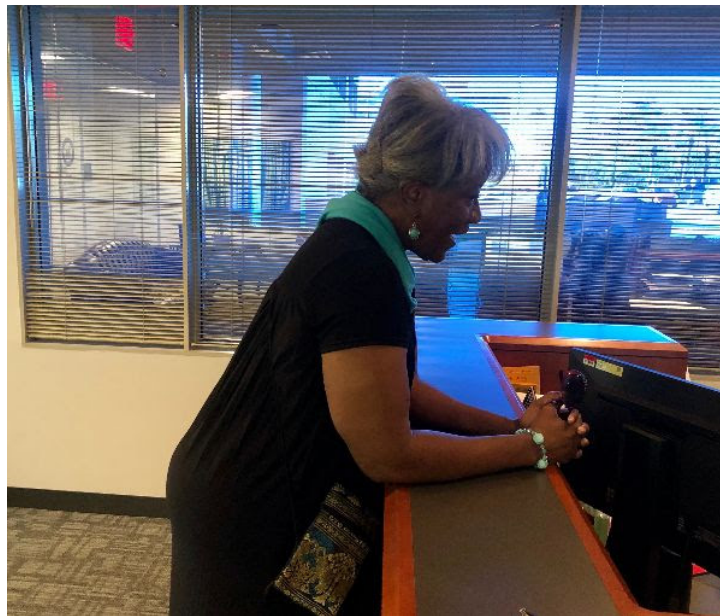

Health Care Advocates & Protect Our Care Arizona Hold Senator McSally Accountable for Pre-Existing Conditions Vote

Senator McSally's Vote Will Harm Arizonans With Pre-Existing Conditions



Phoenix, AZ – After the Senate held a vote on the [Protect Pre-Existing Conditions Resolution](#), Protect Our Care Arizona joined Pat Thomas, an Arizonan with a pre-existing condition, and health care advocates on Thursday to condemn Senator McSally's 'no' vote and failure to protect the health care of Arizonans with pre-existing conditions.

The resolution that Senator McSally voted against would curb the Trump administration's health care sabotage and block the expansion of junk health insurance plans, which discriminate against those with pre-existing conditions and leave patients paying more for care. McSally says she cares about protecting the [2.828.400 Arizonans](#) with pre-existing conditions, but this vote shows she is putting a partisan political agenda ahead of her constituents.

Pat Thomas, an Arizonan with a pre-existing condition, pays a visit to McSally's office every week. She described her frustration with the Senator's vote, saying,

"Protections for pre-existing conditions are crucial. Having them in place keeps me from worrying that I may lose my health insurance coverage. Senator McSally's vote puts millions of Arizonans in danger. She has shown us once again that she puts special interests in Washington before the people she is supposed to represent."

Morgan Tucker, State Director of Protect Our Care Arizona explained the critical nature of this particular vote.

"Senator McSally and Republicans just had another chance to protect health care for people with pre-existing conditions, and they refused," said Tucker. "Arizonans with pre-existing conditions are tired of hearing their Senator lie about supporting protections only to turn around and vote to strip them away."

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
