


Back to School ~ First Day Activity for Gifted Kindergarten Pull-Out Class



A. My Name is Alice: Gather kindergarten group on rug or carpet to read the book. In the story, *Alice* is an *ape*, married to *Alex*, an *anteater*. They come from *Alaska* and sell *ants*. On the following pages, pairs of animals introduce themselves, where they're from, and what they sell, all with fantastic illustrations to go with the letters of the alphabet. After reading the book, turn it into **a game of introductions**. Have each student give

his or her name, the type of animal they are (beginning with the same letter as their first name), and a food or hobby they like. The first student, for example, might say, "J my name is Jennifer. I'm a jaguar, and I like to eat jam." Depending on your students and the size of the group, you can add an additional challenge: players must repeat what each previous player has said before adding to it.

After the first player, for example, the next student might say, “J, her name is Jennifer, she’s a jaguar, and she likes to eat jam,” and then adds his own: “C, my name is Carlos, I’m a cat, and I like to eat candy.” Introductions continue and everyone helps anyone who gets stuck. This activity is a great way for students to get to know one another and is also an informal assessment strategy for the teacher.
