## Hawk Happenings - Week of May 19 - May 23, 2025



### PHOTOS

#### COLOR DAYS

White: Our Hawk spelling detectives used their digraph knowledge of wh & their sight word knowledge of it & their silent e knowledge to write the word: white. We brainstormed a list of 20 white things and reviewed color blending (i.e. **red** + **yellow** = **orange**, etc.). The kids collected nature items and made gorgeous white/black prints.



Red: Reading about the color red, making beautiful red cardinals, writing about our feelings on Red Day, and displaying our brightness in the forest



**Orange:** Did you know there is no word that rhymes with orange?! We thought about the color through our senses, and then brainstormed a list of how the rainbow colors make us feel. The Hawks explored different shades of orange and feasted on lots of orange food!



**Yellow:** When life gives you lemons, make lemonade. The Hawks used their 5 senses to truly experience a lemon today and that helped them understand the above adage. We used yellow watercolor to magically reveal secret drawings.



**Green:** Big green monsters & Ivy Creek!



**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks learned about the upcoming holiday of Shavuot which commemorates the Jewish people receiving the Torah on Mount Sinai. Haya and the Hawks talked about a few of the 10 commandments and the kids designed their own tablets.




## Hawk Happenings - Week of May 12 - May 16, 2025

### PHOTOS

**READING** - Reading comprehension practice (who, what, when, where, and most importantly, why) - comparing and contrasting books with similar settings and characters but different plots and resolutions / reading sight words / Word family contests / Is a stick always a stick? No! Sometimes it's a magic wand - or a toothbrush - or a hammer! The Hawks imagined all sorts of creative/out-of-the-box uses for a stick and described them in writing.



**MATH** - Addition & Subtraction/ Using all our math tools to solve addition and subtraction equations / Learning about patterns in number families (8-3=5 / 8-5=3 / 3+ 5=8 / 5 + 3=8)

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - Working together and cooperating makes things easier.



Not only do we work together as a whole class, but also with partners. **Symmetry** drawings slowed us down and made us concentrate to mirror what our partners drew. You can see these drawings in our photo link!

We all have **BIG** feelings sometimes. They affect each of us differently, sometimes making our bodies feel different. How do you calm yourself when you're buffeted by strong emotions? Nishi, our class sloth, led the class in a special breathing exercise that we can use at home.

As we start to wind down the school year, we're preparing ourselves to say goodbye to our very special classroom friends (Fuzzy, Nishi, Shababa, Sammy, Mama & Baby Owl, and Hank. And our friends are adjusting to the fact that they won't see us anymore. 
# Hawk Happenings - Week of May 5 - May 9, 2025

## PHOTOS

**READING** - Writing C-V-C words / Phonetic writing exercises / Poetry (rhythm, rhyme, syllables, sight words, compound words) / Comparing & contrasting plot lines & details in Gingerbread Man stories/Sight word review


**MATH** - Addition facts & families (How many ways can we add to 10? 9 + 1 / 7 + 3, etc.), #20 / Review of all the math tools we use to solve problems (fingers, drawing, 10-frames, dice, tallies, number lines, Rek-n-reks, manipulatives

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - "I like me" - The Hawks wrote about what parts of themselves they appreciate.



We also explored how music affects our feelings. The kids listened to 4 different classical music selections from Beethoven, Mussorgorsky, and Brahms and drew how the music made them feel ("scared / calm / wanting to dance / gave me energy / made me sleepy", etc)

At Forest School, we see spiders in different locations. The Hawks delved into how spiders spin webs using radial and orb lines. We watched an amazing time-lapse video of a spider building its web. We also used webs to help us practice mindful breathing.



**SCIENCE** - Not only have we been learning about Reduce/Reuse/Recycle, but we've been practicing them daily. Turning off the sink, using less paper towels, picking up trash - these are all things the Hawks are doing to protect our planet. The kids also designed and created unique art and utilitarian objects out of recycled materials.

We want to take care of the world, and another way to do that is through beautifying it! The Hawks assembled seed bombs which you can throw anywhere you want beauty to be seen. They came home in backpacks today!

We had a WONDERFUL trip to the Botanical Garden this morning, after hiking there with the Oak class. We had a tour by BG guides and learned much about plants, trees, and the stream.



**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks practiced Hebrew greetings and learned about *Counting the Omer* (a ritual practice of self-reflection for 49 days). A story about King Solomon making a tough decision led to an interesting class discussion.

**READING** - Digraphs practice (wh,th,ch,sh)/ focus on b,d,g,j (often tricky sounds/letters to write), vowel practice and using them correctly to write words / Phonetic free writing exercises (describing an alien - see below)

**MATH** - #20 / Identifying pennies, nickels, dimes, & quarters , recognizing and writing their values / using addition and subtraction to determine the value of various groups of coins / review of place value with 10's and 1's


**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - Our trip to the Charlottesville-Albemarle Rescue Squad was a wonderful learning experience. The kids asked many questions, toured the station, and got to sit in an ambulance. The First Responders were delighted by the kids' cards and games. We appreciate all the care and efforts of our fellow community members!



We also were thrilled with a visit from Shababa and Nishi, our class sloths, who shared facts about themselves as well as their slow, mindful approach to life.



After reading a story about aliens who have trouble negotiating conflicts, we decided to write the characters a letter with suggestions for resolutions. The Hawks sure know a lot about conflict resolution!



**SCIENCE** - As budding stewards of the Earth, the Hawks have been learning about reducing, reusing, and recycling. We talk about specific ways we each can save energy, such as turning off sinks, using less paper towels, picking up trash, etc.

**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks learned more Hebrew vocabulary this week and practiced counting in Hebrew. Haya shared several Israeli symbols with the class before they collaborated to make a beautiful "Mural for Peace" which now hangs in the hallway at MACAA. Everybody also got to smear on a bit of mud from the Dead Sea.

#### **BIG ANNOUNCEMENT:**

Next Monday (4/28) the Hawks (as part of our emphasis on kindness and gratitude) will be visiting the Charlottesville-Albemarle Rescue Squad at McIntire & the Bypass. We will bring special gifts for the emergency workers. The kids brainstormed a list of questions & asked to sing a kindness song as well.

**READING** - Sight word review, punctuation mark review, checking books for punctuation marks and for every sentence starting with an uppercase letter / Writing CVC words to reinforce short vowel sounds



**MATH** - Pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters - recognizing - counting their value - understanding that they are like fractions - parts of 100 / computing how many of each coin are in \$1

**NATURE STUDIES** - The Hawks wrote their own nature poem by using their senses while in their sit-spots.

*In Spring, at the creek...*

*I see logs in the river, big fish with stripes, and the wrinkling water. I hear babbling, bubbling water and birds.*

*I smell wood and good leaves. I am greeted by the plants, butterflies, and crows.*

We continue to add birds to our bird journals - this week: Green Heron & Mallard. We have spotted 17 birds so far!



**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - The Hawks were eager to share their understanding of the word *mistake* and how making mistakes affects their lives. We pondered the idea that mistakes are useful because they help you learn. And, they provide opportunities for us to activate our imaginations and turn mistakes into "Beautiful Oops." Everyone shared (and received "oohs & aahs") beautiful oops that they created out of paper.



The Kindness Ninjas struck this week, performing a RAK for the Owl class.



**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks learned about *chesed* (loving kindness). They put this character trait into practice by acting out interactions between people (greetings, cheerfulness, offering refreshments, focusing on the conversation and saying farewell).



## Hawk Happenings - Week of April 14 - April 18, 2025

### PHOTOS

**READING** - Phonetic writing (Using adjectives to describe ourselves and our lovies / b & d review / introduction of -ing / Reading and writing -ing words / -ag & -et word families



**MATH** - Adding to 10 with number families / Place value for teen numbers (How many 10's? How many 1's) / Graphing the types of Lovies we brought / Skip counting by 5's & 10's and recognizing the patterns in that skip counting (15, 25, 35, etc.)

**SCIENCE & NATURE STUDIES** - A new approach to "sit spots" - adding a sketch of what you notice around you / Pulling apart a flower to see first hand all the different parts / Learning the names and functions of each part of a flower / observational drawings of azaleas



**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - The Hawks have befriended members of the Charlottesville Retreads, a local seniors softball team. We watch them practice, warm-up, and play. They graciously chat with the kids. This week, we talked about how it's important to have fun when you're playing a game and that can be more valuable then winning or losing. We rooted and cheered for players on both teams. They even invited us to run the bases!



We also talked further about how the players persevere on the field and revisited the ways each one of us continues to persevere, even when something seems really difficult.

**JEWISH STUDIES** - We learned about how pyramids were constructed and built some mini-ones of our own.

## Hawk Happenings - Week of April 7 - April 11, 2025

### PHOTOS

**READING** - Following Dr. Seuss's rhyming themes, the kids sounded out words that rhyme & determined which word in a set was a real word (& which was nonsense) / Alphabetical order: becoming familiar with letters on a printed alphabet so you can check your writing / Poetry - writing a class poem using rainbow colors as similes (as red as... as blue as...) / Introduction of *ing* / Silent *e* review & practice - changing vowel sounds / Digraph review and introduction to hearing and reading digraphs at the ends of words (*ship* /*fish*).

**MATH** - Number of the week: 19/ Arranging numbers (while counting by 10's) in order from 10-100. Representing numbers by tallies and numerals. Graphing goldfish (a la Seuss's One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish) / The Hawks have learned to count by 1's, 5's, and 10's to 100. Now they are learning to recognize numerical patterns when counting by 5's and 10's.



**NATURE STUDIES** - Spring has sprung! The Hawks learned to identify parts of a flower. As everything is beginning to bloom around us, we connected this period of renewal to the Passover holiday and talked about how items on a Seder plate represent new life.




**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - The growth that occurs over the course of a school year is momentous on all levels. It's important that the kids take note of how much they've each changed and all that they've accomplished. One poignant way to share their development is to have them examine their Fall self-portraits and compare them to the Spring portraits they made this week. Can you see the difference?



**JEWISH STUDIES** - We told the Passover story through "Godly Play" (a creative, imaginative method that allows children to find their own meaning within a story). Afterwards, the Hawks illustrated what part of the story resonated most for each one of them. The Hawks also tasted matzah & talked about why we eat it on Passover. They examined Seder plates and practiced singing the "Four Questions" (an important part of the Seder which explains why we do what we do on this holiday). Flashback time - [Matzah Man!](#)



## Hawk Happenings - Week of March 24 - March 27, 2025


### PHOTOS

**READING** - We continue to reinforce our understanding that words in word families rhyme and therefore we can write and read many words once we know the family (dog, log, hog, bog, jog). The Hawks also concentrated on sequencing plot lines in stories and reviewed those confounding b's & d's.

**MATH** - #18, fractions, Number placement and bundling by 10's and 1's (18 is 1 group of 10 and 8 ones)



**SCIENCE** - Just as we pause each day to think about where our food comes from, this week we paused to think about where some of our clothes (those made from wool) originate. We began with sheep and discovered how wool that grows on a sheep is turned into wool. The kids felt different types of wool clothing and began weaving with wool (a wonderful fine motor skill activity!)



**Magnet Exploration** - The Hawks learned about the invisible force of a magnet which exerts a push or a pull on another object. They experimented with the North & South poles of a magnet and discovered what materials are magnetic. The Hawk scientists made predictions and formed hypotheses about whether magnets would work through paper and through water.

**NATURE STUDIES** - The Hawks explored giant dirt mounds at LCEC, and went on a hunt for grubs. They discovered several, including Eastern Dobsonfly Larva!



**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - We've been working on perseverance all year and using our Ometz Levs (brave hearts) on a regular basis as we continue to tackle new challenges. It's been a delight to see the transformation in so many of the Hawks, who began the year with trepidation ("That's too hard! I can't do it.") and now bravely take on new investigations with excitement and curiosity. The weaving above is just 1 example of this. Another shift we've observed is the kids' willingness to take risks. At the beginning of the year, making a hypothesis felt too much for a number of Hawks because they feared being wrong. Now, we recognize that we're curious people and in the process of learning new things, we must be willing to think/wonder/guess/experiment.

And... the Kindness Ninjas struck again! This time, they performed a R.A.K. for the Bluebird class! Shhhhh! The element of surprise is crucial!



**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks continue to practice conversational Hebrew. This week we began talking about Passover traditions and learning what foods belong on a Seder plate.



## Hawk Happenings - Week of March 17 - March 21, 2025


**READING** - Dr. Seuss's books are inspiring a lot of rhyming. Ask your child about, "Stop! You must not hop on Pop!"



After reading *The Cat in the Hat*, we had a Word Family race to see how many words we could write for each word family. We love Magnatiles in our class and used them to help form words from various word families..

We've begun a mini-unit on poetry, listening to Shel Silverstein poems. We wrote our own class poems, based on "I" statements (I am \_\_, I see \_\_, I feel \_\_, I wonder \_\_, I understand \_\_, etc. New vocabulary: *Fortunately, Unfortunately* - The Hawks narrated a class story using these terms repeatedly in the plot line and then illustrated their own tales.

**MATH** - Fractions! The Hawks learned that a fraction is part of a whole and all the parts have to be equal.



The kids can determine whether shapes are divided into equal parts and have been working with  $\frac{1}{2}$ 's,  $\frac{1}{3}$ 's,  $\frac{1}{4}$ 's,  $\frac{1}{6}$ 's &  $\frac{1}{8}$ 's. We've been studying how to write fractions and what goes above the fraction line and what goes below it.

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - It's tick season so the Hawks learned how to identify ticks and how to avoid attracting them. Can you tell the difference between poppy seeds and ticks?



We urge you to watch [this video](#) with your child. The kids know the chorus!

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - The Kindness Ninjas will be performing another RAK next week for the Bluebird Class. This week, the Ninjas drew bluebirds and wrote a story about a bluebird that will be shared with the little birds.

**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks continue to practice greetings in Hebrew. This week's Torah story is about Joseph revealing his identity to his brothers. The big ideas are forgiveness and speaking softly. The Hawks talked about the difference between responding angrily and physically versus taking a breath and responding with quiet determination and clarity.



**READING** - Lots of work with word families! The kids were amazed (their teachers were too!) that they could read 88 words, including these:


Lower case writing review / Sight word review using our word wallets / What's the difference between a poem and a story? Each child read a poem about Spring that contains many sight words as well as visual cues to other vocabulary..

**MATH** - #17 and other teen numbers, more practice telling time to the hour both digitally and in analog form, numerical patterns on a 1-100 chart

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - We're continuing to log in our Bird Journals all the birds we see. We've been listening to their calls, both in the forest & then later from a special bird app.

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - What is the difference between fact & opinion? A fact is something that is always true - you can prove it. *Poison ivy can give you a rash.* An opinion is what you think or feel. You can't prove it. *Broccoli is the best vegetable.* It's ok for people to have their own opinions. It's ok to see and think different things.

For example, what's your opinion about this picture? Is it a duck or a rabbit?



**JEWISH STUDIES** - We acted out the story of Purim and learned how Queen Esther and Mordechai both had Ometz Levs (brave hearts). The take-away from Purim is that it's important for everyone to be brave, to take care of others, and to speak up when someone is not being kind. The Hawks pondered the question: "Why was Haman so mean?" "I think someone taught him to be mean? "Maybe someone was mean to him first." "Maybe someone took something that was Haman's and he got mad." "He didn't like people who were different and did different things." The Hawks learned how to say Happy Purim in Hebrew (Purim Sameach) and made paper hamantaschen filled with kind words.

## Hawk Happenings - Week of March 3 - March 7, 2025

### PHOTOS

**READING** - Tackling those pesky b,d,p, q letters/Review of reading sentences and pointing to words with 1:1 correspondence, upper & lower case letter review / S-Blends (st, sm, sn, sc, sk, sl, sp) / Dr. Seuss mini-unit - Hop on Pop (-op word family) - rhyming - reading lines from the book

**MATH** - Telling time to the hour, digitally and in analog style, drawing hour and minute hands on clock faces, reading clock faces to determine the time / #16 and more work with teen numbers

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - As part of our study of time, we created 3-d representations of the earth revolving around the sun and the moon rotating around the earth (resulting in night and day). We hiked the woods around LCEC, hunted for signs of winter and of spring and found both! We've been birdwatching and are filling up our bird journals. Such an important lesson in being *quiet* so as not to frighten our avian friends.



### SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL

**Ninjas and Buckets** - both crucial components of the week. We learned all about **bucket fillers** and **bucket dippers**. Ask your child about his/her/your **invisible bucket** and how it gets full or empty. Hint: Acts of kindness!



And... (shhhh...this is a surprise which your child may or may not have told you): We have become  
**The Kindness Ninjas!**

Kindness Ninjas can't be seen. But you can see and feel the kindness they spread in the world. Kindness Ninjas don't brag, they just want to make others happy. Kindness Ninjas believe in the power of kindness because they know that kindness spreads happiness all over the world. How do they spread kindness? Through RAK's (Random Acts of Kindness). The Ninjas sneak around and perform acts of kindness without the recipients knowing. Stay tuned as the CBIFS Kindness Ninjas begin to surprise members of our school community! We have told the kids that it's important to keep the element of surprise so the recipients don't find out who we are. That's why they may or may not have mentioned any of this to you. ;)

**READING** - Sight Word review - Can your child read all these words?

Lots of practice this week with C-V-C words, writing and reading them, with an emphasis on vowels & final consonant sounds.. It's very cool that you turn 1 word into another just by changing 1 letter / Digraph review and practice (sh, th, ch, wh) / Breaking down words into syllables to make it easier to phonetically write (wa-ter-me-lon) - Ask your child how to do a "quiet yell" to determine how many syllables are in a word.

**MATH** - Teen numbers (how many 10's, how many 1's) / #15 - Counting to 15 using 1:1 correspondence, what comes before and after #15/ Can your child write the numbers 1-20?/Assessment time!

The big conclusion to our measurement study was visiting the "Doctor's Office" and measuring height, weight, heads, arms, feet, and even giving shots.




The Hawks also played around with tessellation, creating Stars of David out of 12 triangle shapes.

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - The Hawks worked on knot tying, an important skill when you're out in the forest and you need to set up a shelter. We finished our unit on shadows/sun & moon/day/night.



### **SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL**

What is the difference between **bragging** & being **humble**? Ask your child about examples of both and about the biggest creature in the ocean. We made Be Kind bees, get it?



As you've heard, we are filling up our class Bucket of Kindness. Did you know that everyone has an **invisible bucket**? When you do something kind or someone does an act of kindness for you, you get a drop in your bucket. If you do something hurtful or someone does something hurtful to you, you lose a drop from your bucket. We endeavor to fill **everyone's** buckets!

### **P.E.**

In keeping with our math theme of measurement, the Hawks demonstrated how fast, how high, and how far they could move their bodies.



## JEWISH STUDIES

The Hawks are learning to have conversations in Hebrew. This week they added "tov/tovah (good). They also learned part of the Torah story about Pharoah, and Joseph and his brothers. The story's theme is teshuvah (forgiveness). The Hawks talked about the power of feelings and whether it's ok to cry. They also thought about the idea that when we judge others favorably we add holiness to the world.

**READING** - Sight word review / Review of lower case letter formation / blending sounds /t/ + /en/ = ten/ / How do you change pot to pat to cat to cut to hut ?

**MATH** - #14 / Measurement with non-standard measuring tools and with standard measuring tools, such as a ruler / How do you actually use a ruler? / Rounding up to the nearest inch / Teen numbers (14 has 1 set of 10 & 4 ones - you write the 1 first and then the 14 - left to right)

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - Everyone was excited to taste our Pine Needle Soda - "Yum! Can I have more?" We began our study of shadows, learning that the earth travels around the sun, creating day & night as well as the seasons. The Hawks tried shadow drawing.



Thanks to the generosity of a friend, the Hawks got to visit baby chicks and learn how they react to sound, movement, and food.



We had a lovely day at Ivy Creek, observing and listening to Bluebirds, Robins, Tufted Titmice, Carolina Wrens, a Hawk, a Red-bellied Woodpeckers, House finches, and Crows. Since it was Tu B'Shevat, we designed birthday cakes for the trees out of nature objects and made Happy Birthday cards for the trees in our Nature Journals. 




**MATH** - # of the week: 13 / Place value: Ask your child how many 10's & how many 1's are in 13. Measurement: Weight (heavy / light) & Temperature

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** We began studying the water cycle with a cloud experiment, creating condensation! And we brainstormed how we can be water protectors.



We've been counting by 1's, 5's and 10's all year and this week, that paid off as we began our study of temperature and made our own thermometers!



We collected lots of pine needles at Unity Field and after cleaning them thoroughly, the kids watched Erika make "Pine Needle Soda." We'll get to taste it on Monday!

Ask your Hawk about wolves in Yellowstone Park. Hearing the true tale of how wolves disappeared and then were reintroduced to the park, reminded us of how all of nature is connected and dependent on all its separate parts.

### SOCIAL STUDIES

One new vocabulary word this week was cartographer. The Hawks are cartographers and we're so excited to collect their bedroom maps!


We also learned about Punxsutawney Phil from Punxsutawney, PA - a.k.a. The Official Groundhog. If Phil sees his shadow: 6 more weeks of winter. If he doesn't: Spring is coming soon! On **Sunday, February 2**, make sure to check the news and let your child know Phil's 2025 forecast!





## NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES


As part of our studies of the states of matter, we took advantage of the chilly temps to turn a fluids into solids. With the gorgeous ice we created, we made even more beautiful art!





### READING

Identifying beginning sounds and ending sounds (the trickiest part) in words / 2 new sight words: what & who. Vowel & digraph review (with a heavy focus on wh). We read a mini book containing our new and old sight words. Every Hawk is learning to recognize his/her last name in print. The kids practice phonetic spelling daily and of late we're seeing an explosion of self-motivated writing (letters to family/friends, mini books & maps)!



### MATH

Number of the week: 12 - Measurement: height & length using non-standard items for measuring - Sequencing numbers (what comes before/after) / Place value (for example: 18 vs. 81)

### NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES



We began our study of the 3 states of matter (liquid, gas, solid). Studying these states meshes perfectly with all the snow, as we get to observe it in the 3 different forms! The Hawks also learned 3 knot-tying strategies and practiced tying these knots with ropes. This took great perseverance!

The Winter Dioramas that came home today are the results of a multi-step project and part of our study of how animals adapt, hibernate, or migrate in the winter. The kids collected nature materials, painted the boxes, and worked with the air-dry clay.



## SOCIAL STUDIES

We are delving deeper into our study of maps and directions. The kids know the difference between a globe and a map, understand different ways maps are used and created, and are learning about map symbols, including a compass.. They also are learning the difference between a state and the whole USA. This week, everyone drew a map of the inside of our MACAA classroom (though a few shifted and just made general maps...).



## SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL

**Stop, Think, and Choose / Perseverance / Kindness** - These are 3 of the most important themes of our K year. It's been delightful to listen to the Hawks talk about all the big and small ways that they are each persevering. Ask your Hawk what he/she is working on! We'd also like to note that in the map activity above, not a single child balked ("I can't do this! It's too hard! I don't know how to do this!") In fact, the room was silent as each child planned, drew, and applied her/his knowledge in a new way.

## JEWISH STUDIES

The Hawks continued their study of conversational Hebrew with the addition of *Ima & Abba* (mother and father). Haya shared the Torah story about Jacob & Esau which led to a class discussion about sibling relationships and ways to solve problems and conflicts.





**MATH** - Place value (10's and 1's) / Teen numbers - What is  $10 + 6$ ?  $10 + 2$ ? / Correct number formation / 1:1 counting / Counting forwards and backwards - A rousing game of dreidel helped the kids count, recognize symbols, and practice sportsmanship.

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - We've been exploring new trails at LCEC, discovering beaver chews, sand pits, and fantastical spots to play in the woods. As the Winter Solstice approaches, we are noticing & appreciating the many evergreens and conifers that surround us in the forest.



**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - A fabulous story, *Seeds and Trees*, provided an opportunity to talk about kind words versus mean ones. **READING** - Reading sentences that contain our sight words and C-V-C words (Can you see the sun?) / ? versus . / ch digraph + review of sh & th / Rhyming Dust Bunnies! - ask your child about them - they teach us about word families + what happens to words when you substitute different initial consonants? / 2 new sight words: look & at.

**MATH** - Following patterns of adding 1 or 2 to sets of objects. If you have a set of 3 apples, and then a set of 5, what set would come next? Ordinal numbers - Find the 5th object from the left / the 2nd one from the right /Counting to 100 / Recognizing and writing teen numbers

**NATURE & SCIENCE STUDIES** - Adaptation/Migration/Hibernation - The kids know the meanings, behaviors, and animals associated with all 3 of these wintertime adjustments. The Hawks are hard at work on a multi-step project to create winter habitats (using your donated shoe boxes!).

We continue to study fire building. And, we enjoyed roasted apples cooked over hot flames!



**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - Inspired by Jeremy's Dreidel, a story about a boy with a blind parent, we imagined what it be like to be blind and have to depend on our other senses.



We examined letters in the Braille alphabet. The Hawks also have a special new song that reminds us to calm down and let go of "small stuff" that's bothering us.

## **JEWISH STUDIES** - Why do we eat foods cooked in oil on Hanukah? The Hawks tasted latkes, some for the very first time!



We listened to Haya retell the Hanukah story through Godly Play. The class learned about the Jewish value of creating light (Yotzer) and brainstormed ways they could each bring light into the world. They also added a new Hebrew phrase to their conversation studies: "Nahim me-od" - Nice to meet you.

We've also been spinning dreidels and learning what the letters mean. We hope you enjoy your keepsake Dreidel Game Board that came home today. Your child worked hard on it and we hope your family enjoys it for years to come!

**NATURE STUDIES** - *Flame Bond Crackle?* That's the name of the fire the Hawks built with "tinder, mouse tails, pencils, thumbs, and arms." Those words relate to the size of the wood collected by the kids. The Hawks also learned 2 ways to build a structure for starting a fire: the log cabin method & the lean-to.



As part of our seasonal nature study, the Hawks learn about the 3 ways that animals handle winter: Hibernation / Adaptation/Migration. We use compasses to help us find our way and birds use internal compasses to find their way south to warmer climates.

**JEWISH STUDIES** - We shared the story of Hanukah and its meaning and tied it to having an **Ometz Lev** (a brave heart). The kids were surprised to learn that each one of them already has a courageous, brave heart. We conducted a dreidel spinning extravaganza and learned what the letters on the dreidel mean. Hanukah is celebrated all around the world, even in Antarctica! The Hawks were mesmerized by the true story of a scientist who created a hanukiyah (menorah) on the ocean floor in frigid conditions. Ask your child what that hanukiyah was made out of!



Haya shared this week's Torah portion and the Hawks added "Nayim Me-od" (nice to meet you) to their Hebrew conversations.




**MATH** - Number of the week: 10 / Practice with ordinal numbers / shape drawing

**NATURE STUDIES** - This week we explored new trails at LCEC and spent time in "sit-spots," sitting quietly and listening to the sounds around us. "That made me feel peaceful!" The Hawks also wove gorgeous wreaths out of bittersweet vine and different berries. We added opossums to our study of nocturnal animals, learning about their diet, habitat, and behaviors. We hope you enjoy the gorgeous wreaths your children wove out of invasive species. These contain bittersweet berries which are beautiful and festive, but toxic if ingested. If you would like to display them, we suggest hanging them outside, especially if you have younger children prone to putting things in their mouths in the household.


**SOCIAL STUDIES** - The Hawks studied a globe this week, learning about land masses, bodies of water, the equator, and the Northern and Southern hemispheres. We located Charlottesville on the globe and compared globes to maps.

**Continued below...**

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - As part of learning about globes, we talked about how when people argue it creates conflict. Even grownups struggle with this and that's why we have wars around the world. The kids decided that kings, queens, and Presidents should try listening to each other the way we do at school. Just as we wish in our daily snack blessing that everyone will have enough food, we also wish peace for everyone in the world. The Hawks learned how to draw the symbol for peace and added their own illustrations and words to explain what makes them each feel peaceful.



As we gear up for Thanksgiving break, we talked about how to say thank you in Hebrew (*todah*) and shared what we are each thankful for. Their words and illustrations will be part of our 3rd class book!

**MATH** - Number of the Week: 9 / Color: Brown / Shape: Oval / Counting by 1's, 5's, 10's - Can your child tell you how many days are in a week and what they are? How about the months of the year? Recognizing numbers up to 20



**NATURE STUDIES** - How do invasive species affect the forest? They take over and don't allow other plants to thrive. The Hawks demonstrated this in a race with beanbags (invasive species teams - ran, non-invasive - walked). Who collected the most bean bags? The invasive species of course. As part of our study of nocturnal animals, we learned about owls, what they eat, their habits, and which owls live near us.

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - We hope your kids came home with their Bug/Wish cards and shared their meaning with you. This is another technique to use to solve conflicts. "It bugs me when you knock down my structure. I wish you wouldn't do that anymore". We also met Sid the Squirrel who taught us about squabbling & sharing, and how the latter is much preferable to the former. We also met Nishi the sloth's cousin, Shababa (both their names have the -sh sound!), who taught us meditative breathing. .



**JEWISH STUDIES** - The Hawks learned the story of Noah's ark through the method of Godly Play. They created their own rainbow (like in the story) out of beautiful fall leaves.




The Hawks reviewed 7 and moved on to 8 (writing the number and representing it in different formats (subitizing). Graphing and patterns practice too.

**NATURE STUDIES** - Since 8 is our # this week and the octagon is our shape, we studied spiders who have 8 legs. The Hawks frequently see spiders, so learning about their characteristics and role in the ecosystem helps dispel fears and desires to squish them. As part of our study about nocturnal animals, we read and learned about foxes, and made our own fox faces!

**SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL** - In our daily snack blessing there's a line: "Maybe one day no one will be hungry and everyone will be fed." Some families don't have enough money to buy food or toys, so kids around the world persevere and make their own toys using recycled materials. Ask your child about galimotos (and check them out in the photo link).

This week Batman brought his friend, Capman, who introduced us to the -ap word family / Focus on hearing and writing initial consonants in words / Sentence structure (a sentence is a group of words separated by spaces, that starts with an uppercase letter & ends with punctuation) / Syllables - counting how many parts are in 2,3,4 syllable words/ New letter: **Kk** - lots of practice writing this tricky letter / WORD WALLETS! Each Hawk now has his/her own Word Wallet to hold (& practice) all the sight words we're learning (we added and & like). .

## MATH

Number 7 writing / Counting (by 1's, 5's, 10's) / Patterns / Graphing / Estimation (The Hawks estimated how many seeds were in a pumpkin and then they counted them all, by 10's. The total? 342!

## SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL

Has your child ever interrupted you while you're speaking? We're assuming 100% of you will answer in the affirmative. We compared our mouths to volcanos that erupt and talked about how it feels to be interrupted. The kids brainstormed actions they could undertake instead of interrupting. And we continue to promote perseverance, even when things are difficult.

## JEWISH STUDIES

The Hawks learned how to be a "sofer" (a Torah scribe) and even practiced using feathers to write and draw. They also began learning how to sing the alphabet in Hebrew.

## NATURE STUDIES

As most of you know, superheroes, villains, & pirates are popular themes with this year's crew. This week the kids learned about *Invasive Species*, plants with superpowers. Some can grow super fast and steal the sunlight from other plants. Some, like stiltgrass are super villains that poison the soil so no other plants can grow. We went on a hike to spot invasive species that are all around us.

We also learned what a lifecycle is by studying how a seed grows into a pumpkin. Eric Carle's, The Tiny Seed reinforced the idea of life cycles and helped us understand why a flower (or pumpkin) needs so many seeds to keep the species alive..

Teamwork + Perseverance - The Hawks worked in teams to use a set of blocks to make towers. This required planning, cooperation, kindness, and a lot of perseverance.

Listening + imagination = Cooperative storytelling - The Hawks regularly invent stories as a whole group, taking turns adding to the plots. One of the values we learn is how to take care of ourselves, other people, and the world. What if everyone... was an important theme this week. What if everyone picked flowers off a bush? What if everyone picked up their toys? What if everyone stayed up all night? What if everyone left no trash behind?


