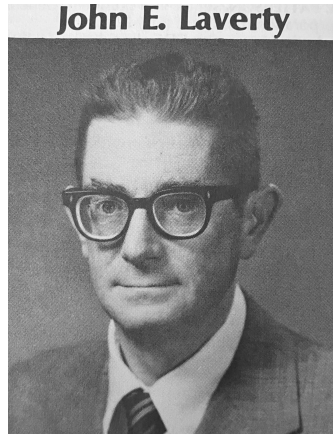


John (Jack) E. Lavery

John Lavery, CBT Executive, Dies at Age 47

John E. Lavery of 24 Ridge Road, Cromwell, executive vice president and head of the Commercial Finance Group of the Connecticut Bank and Trust Co., died Tuesday at Middlesex Memorial Hospital, Middletown. He was 47.

Born in Middletown, Lavery attended Quinnipiac College in New Haven, the University of Connecticut, the National Association of Bank Auditors and Controllers School of the University of Wisconsin, and the Harvard Business School Advanced Management Program.

Lavery, an Army veteran, joined CBT in 1957 in the controllers department. He was named controller in 1971 and advanced to senior vice president in 1972. In 1974, he was elected executive vice president and was named head of commercial finance in 1979.

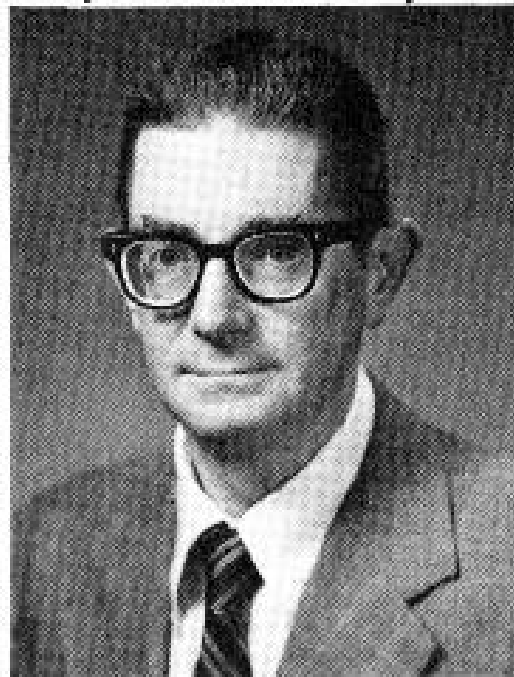
Lavery served as a member of the board of directors, finance committee and executive committee of the Hartford Ballet Co. A member of the Hartford Club, he was a former trustee of the Connecticut Public Expenditure Council and a former director of Junior Achievement of North Central Connecticut Inc.

He leaves his wife, Sheila A. Lavery; two sons, James E. Lavery and John M. Lavery, and a daughter, Colleen Marie Lavery, all at home, and his mother, Ann C. Lavery of Middletown.
