

German Riding Pony

The development of the German Riding Pony began around 1965 by breeding Welsh ponies with Dulmen, Connemara, New Forest, Arabian, and Anglo-Arabian bloodlines. Nicknamed a 'miniature warmblood,' this breed has a horselike appearance in a smaller 13.2-14.2 hand package. The German Riding Pony is known for their athleticism, elegance, and rideability. They excel in disciplines of dressage, show jumping, eventing, and driving, and are also influential in the Hunter Pony divisions in the United States. They come in most solid colors.
