Competitive CS is a fast-paced and demanding environment, and to succeed, you must be able to define and hold a clear line. That's why I am attached to work with people with whom I share a culture and ideology, with whom I align in just a few words. This is something I found with Remy and that I know is a priceless asset in our young scene. So his departure has weighed on my decision.

The most painful struggles teach the most valuable lessons. A blow like this has to be a wake-up call. We are lucky enough to have highly committed and talented players. The key to future success lies in the ability to make these pieces work cohesively, since CS is like any team sports, a game in which the strength of the collective plays a key role in the moments that matter the most. I trust the boys and the people surrounding them to take the right step towards greater consistency in the future.

I want to thank all the players, staff, employees and managers of G2 and, more broadly, all the people I have met along the way, for your help and support in this journey. I will be forever grateful for the ride and I want to express my profound gratitude to all of you for inspiring me. A special shoutout to the #G2ARMY that has grown over the years and has always been a great source of motivation for us.
