

Like, I really love ketchup. If you put enough ketchup on anything, it'll taste like ketchup. And that's a great thing. Not many things can claim that. But it also means that *which* ketchup you use is of paramount importance.







Celestalon @Celestalon · Oct 25 10. Heinz Simply

Heinz is a staple among ketchups, and their Simply version replaces the normal high fructose corn syrup with cane sugar, resulting in a sweeter, albeit oilier, sauce. An excellent choice for any general purpose ketchup need.

A decent all-natural ketchup. A little sweet, a little tart. I'm not personally a fan of how much thinner it is than most ketchups, but otherwise pretty good.

8. Whataburger Spicy

A solid spicy ketchup at 8th place. Though it may have a little more spice than I'd like for a general purpose ketchup, but goes great in a situation befitting it.

Only at #7 but don't let that fool you. This is the gold standard, what everything else is measured against. As far as widely-available mass produced ketchups go, you can't find better.

This one has a strong sweetness to it that is just perfect to go on a burger with some grilled onions.

As we get into the top 5, the real winners start to appear. Whataburger makes its second appearance, with their fancy (traditional) ketchup. A little sweeter than most, a little thicker, and a hint of garlic that makes this one really stand out.

We're getting serious now, into ketchups you've likely never heard of (but really should). Sir Kensington's – a ketchup for when you really want to taste your ketchup. This sauce is extremely tomato-heavy, almost like a rich, extra thick tomato jam....



1. Catch-Up Packs!

Ever thought about coming back to Hearthstone, but then remembered all the cards you missed and would have to collect? This new type of pack completely flips that overwhelming feeling upside down. Up to 50 cards per pack, based on your standard collection size! We're giving out a bunch of these for free, and adding a bunch to new expansion bundles at no extra cost.

For example, excited by the new Showdown in the Badlands expansion, but haven't played in a few years? Grab the megabundle, and all the free Catch-Up Packs, and you'll end up with over half the cards from the last 2yr. There are bundles for gold or huge discounts to raise that even further. And they're all real cards, you can disenchant them and craft what you want to play, etc.

All in all, this DRASTICALLY reduces what's needed to come back to the game (or join for the first time) and get meta-competitive!





Are they REALLY that good? I'd say so. Here are the juicy details.

- Same rarity distribution as normal packs, all non-golden.

- Card count varies from 5 to 50.

- The goal is to help people catch up quick and easy, while still being the same size as normal packs for high-collection players.

- The count is calculated per expansion. 1 to 10 cards per expansion = 5 to 50 cards total

- Below 25% collection? You get the max.

- Above 75% collection? You get the min.

- Between those it just scales linearly.

- It's based on cards you've ever owned, same as duplicate protection.

- Since the pack size can vary, the first legendary and guaranteed rares are calculated per card. The first legendary is PER EXPANSION (so yes, that means 5 accelerated legendaries).
