






Start your grown-up science fair projects! (Geoff)

Third Year of Energy Benchmarking Data on the Open Data Portal

The City of Chicago has launched the newest Energy Benchmarking data as part of the Energy Benchmark ordinance passed in 2013, which includes information on energy consumption, size of buildings, ENERGY STAR® rating and more. For the first time, the data now includes residential buildings over 50,000 square feet. Nearly 2,700 properties are available in the data set, which was released alongside the most recent edition of the Chicago Energy Benchmarking Report for 2016.

Second hackathon Latin@ Hacking did, focused on housing, in Pilsen on a Saturday in November.

3 Teams at the hackathon:

Reclaiming mi barrio: empowering tenants through storytelling.

- (Winner) Renter Power: making open data accessible to housing advocates. Somos Logan Square and Autonomous Tenants Union
- Zoning Invaders: making zoning meetings transparent

Problem: 30,000 evictions are filed each year in Cook County. Almost half of tenants in eviction cases don't go to court. 95% of tenants who do go to court appear pro se (self-representing) to eviction hearings, which tend to last 90 seconds on average. Cook county does not have: *just cause eviction*, *rent control*.

Knowledge is your leverage.

Currently have a large gentrification problem. Without legal protections, they got creative. They used public information to find information about the owners. Most housing is owned by LLCs, you can find main investors. Can find code violations and alderman information. Find lawsuits filed against unethical landlord - share with investors and potential consumers. Also disincentivized investors. Got alderman to send a letter to investors to get landlord to negotiate with tenants. Also tried to organizer tenants across entire landlord portfolio.

Technical Problems: websites clunky, some require specialized knowledge, cross-referencing. Tedious process that takes hours and days to find information. Wanted to build website to make finding that easier. Original goal was to build automated workflow. But given that there was 6 hours, they built step by step process.

Next up: complete the "worksheet" website. They have a mock-up of what it could look like. Need more user interface design. Also want to build another website that is an automated workflow for entire process. Most websites don't have REST APIs, so you'd have to create webscrapers. Need web development help for that.

Questions

What system did you use to build website right now: HTML, CSS, Javascript.

Hope of developing website to prevent tenant from going to court? How does this win in court? Eviction is actually start of 30 day negotiation. (missed a lot of good information)

What happened to Rent strikes? Can we ban together tenants across buildings? That was an intention of this project. There is a rent reduction letter in Chicago. Primary crisis right now is in conditions. Landlords actually want you to not pay your rent. We can talk about it more. Risky, doesn't sound like great choice.

If you have all the data about the landlords, can you identify those problem landlords? Have you looked at "naughty landlords" city releases?

A lot of tenants don't know who their landlord is. They hide behind multiple LLCs. Reaching out to landlords personally can help. Chicago's list is about code violations not unethical practices.

(didn't catch the question)

Majority of folks sued for evictions are being sued because they have some other crisis in their life that makes it so they can't pay their rent. Landlords do scary things like having a friend dressing up as a cop saying they're going to take their stuff. Even though in Chicago only Sheriff's can lock you out. But most people don't know better and will leave before 30 days arrives.

Landlords will threaten with immigration raids.

Renters may not want information because of immigration status. Also scares people away from housing court.

Organization lost space because landlord doubled their rent.

Fighting gentrification or people not getting evicted?

Import issue to discuss as we continue in the next year.

Assuming website completed. How would you make it well known to people who actually use it? Example: mother of 3 being evicted. No, she doesn't have a computer. She has an iphone. Put your phone on speaker. Within 5 minutes she had access and information to use the website. The people that were involved (i.e. organizational people) would be the distributors to their clients.

Would be interested in creating APIs for websites that don't already have them.

Cook county recorder of deeds website closed down was a problem. If you know how to get at that data let them know. (merged with another office in 2020)
