General Submission Guidelines:

For general submissions to be published online, we accept art and writing. Writing may include short stories (any genre), poetry, and creative nonfiction. Each submission must be <1500 words per story. Art may include photographs, single comic strips, photography, paintings, drawings, and digital art. You may submit as many pieces of art and writing as you want. Please include the titles of your piece.

We publish submissions on our website on a rolling basis.

Please provide your full name, graduating year, and email along with your submissions. In addition, if you would like to have your work published anonymously, please indicate that along with the previous information. If you are submitting multiple pieces at once, please submit in one document with page breaks to indicate separation.
