

# Health Care in England

## What is a GP?

A GP (General Practitioner), or family doctor, is someone who can help you when you are unwell.

Anyone in England can see a GP.

You need to register with a local GP practice to make an appointment.

Do not wait until you are unwell - register straight away so that you can get an appointment if you become unwell.



## Finding a GP

Scan the QR code and put in your postcode to find a GP near you.

You may be able to register online or go to the GP practice reception and ask to register.

You do not need ID or a fixed address to register with a GP.

You can take the 'access card' (below) with you to help when registering.



**I have the right to register and receive treatment from a GP practice**

I do not need a fixed address.

I do not need identification.

Anyone in England can see a GP.

### What is 111?

You can also phone 111 for free if you are unwell and you don't know what help you need. You can ask for a translator if you need one.



### What is 999?

You can phone 999 if it is an **emergency** and you need help immediately for a serious medical problem. Ask for an ambulance. You will need to provide your postcode.

### What is A&E?



A & E, or Accident and Emergency or Emergency Department, is at the Hospital, and you should go there if you have a very serious medical problem.

There are 2 hospitals in Leeds city centre (St James's Hospital and Leeds General Infirmary)

A & E for **children** (16 years or under) is at Leeds General Infirmary (LGI), LS1 3EX.

### What is a Dentist?

A dentist is someone who can help you when you have a problem with your teeth. You can visit your dentist for regular (every six months) check-ups to help to keep your teeth healthy.

## Sexual Health

You can access sexual health care from a GP or at a sexual health clinic. This includes support to access free contraception, testing for sexually transmitted infections, and pregnancy testing.
