Record/Showcase Awards:

There following awards are given based on Record/Showcase submissions

1. Record/Showcase Placing – Based on the rating received when the record book is reviewed, a member will receive a sticker ribbon indicating their placing.

- 2. County Project Award Members may identify three projects (1st choice, 2nd choice, 3rd choice) in which they would like to be considered for a county project award. To advance from the club level to be considered for a county project award, Silver Achievement must be met (see Record/Showcase Guide).
- 3. Overall Award/Gold Achievement Award A member who receives a county project award may be considered for an overall record book award. To advance from county project award level to be considered for overall award, certain criteria must be met (see Record Book Score Sheet).

4. Cloverbud Award – Cloverbuds who complete and submit a Cloverbud Activity Book/Showcase will receive recognition at the Achievement Program.

HCE Award: The Home Economic Awards are selected and provided by the members of the Home and Community Education Association. Selection is based upon the recipient's story of the project as represented in the record book.

Criteria: All Members are eligible (3 awards); based on the member's records of the project and their

overall participation in the project area. One award per age group: Grades 3-13.

Local Salute to Excellence-Volunteer Recognition Awards: recognizes 4-H volunteers who demonstrate exemplary service to 4-H, while promoting service through volunteerism as both an opportunity and a privilege. Each county gives its own Lifetime Volunteer of the Year and Volunteer of the year award

Criteria: One award will be given to a volunteer who has been volunteering for more than 10

years and one for less than 10 years.

Selection is based on: positive impact the nominee has had on 4-H and on 4-H youth; nominees ability to work with young people on projects and activities in a way that promotes decision making, problem-solving, meeting challenges, mastery and youth/adult partnerships; nominee's innovative approaches to engaging youth and increasing diversity among participants; how nominee exemplifies a "mentor-learner" relationship with participants; dedication to a safe and inclusive environment; how nominee models character and professional behavior when interacting with participants, families, and community partners; nominee's innovative approaches to performing volunteer service; increased funding/resources/new initiatives generated by nominee; recruitment of additional 4-H volunteers; personal growth from being a 4-H volunteer.
