## Genetic Testing Finds One-Third of Westbank Restaurants Serving Imported Shrimp Without Disclosure

**SeaD Genetic Testing Reveals Low Shrimp Authenticity Rates on the Westbank of New Orleans**

**Westbank, La. — December 29, 2025** — SeaD Consulting today announced the results of genetic testing using their Rapid ID Genetic High-accuracy Test ([RIGHTTest™](#)) conducted on shrimp dishes served at restaurants across the Westbank of New Orleans. Testing revealing significantly lower authenticity rates than those previously found in Slidell and the greater New Orleans area.

The Westbank, a collection of communities located just across the Mississippi River from downtown New Orleans, is widely known for its rich cultural heritage, strong neighborhood identities, and long-standing seafood traditions. With deep ties to commercial fishing families and Louisiana cuisine, the area is often assumed by consumers to be a reliable source of local wild-caught shrimp.

Between December 16 and 17, 2025, SeaD sampling teams conducted **random genetic testing at 24 restaurants** throughout the Westbank. Samples were analyzed to determine whether shrimp marketed or implied as local wild-caught Louisiana shrimp were authentic.

### Key Findings

- **16 of 24 restaurants (66%)** were found to be serving **authentic local wild-caught shrimp**
- **8 of 24 restaurants (33%)** were found to be serving **imported, farm-raised shrimp**
  - None of the eight restaurants had signage as required by law indicating they were selling imports

- Seven of the eight restaurants verbalized and/or had menus indicating domestic wild-caught shrimp were being served
- One of the eight restaurant's staff did not know what was being served

These findings indicate a substantially **lower authenticity rate** than SeaD's previous testing in [Slidell](#) and [New Orleans proper](#), both of which demonstrated higher compliance with local seafood authenticity expectations.

## Louisiana Labeling Law Non-Compliance

In addition to genetic findings, SeaD's sampling team reported **zero compliance** with Louisiana's seafood disclosure laws among restaurants found to be serving imported shrimp. State law requires restaurants serving imported shrimp to clearly disclose that information to consumers through signage or menu language. **None of the eight restaurants serving imports displayed any such disclosure**, despite legal requirements.

Head of the Louisiana Shrimp Task Force Andrew Blanchard said, "We are happy to share all the results of the genetic testing with the Louisiana Department of Health upon their request." He added, "When the local shrimp is so abundant, there's no excuse not to serve them."

## Restaurants Found to Be Serving Authentic Local Wild-Caught Shrimp

The following restaurants were confirmed through genetic testing to be serving authentic Louisiana wild-caught shrimp:

Of note is that [Westwego market](#) vendors were tested independently by Fox TV News Reporter Meg Gatto and Louisiana Illuminator Reporter Wes Muller using SeaD's RIGHTTest previously. The ones SeaD tested this go around were also found to be authentically providing local wild-caught shrimp.

### Context and Consumer Impact

SeaD's testing highlights ongoing challenges facing Louisiana's seafood economy, where imported shrimp continues to be sold without proper disclosure, undermining both consumer trust and local fishing communities. The Westbank's lower authenticity rate underscores the need for increased enforcement, transparency, and consumer awareness.
