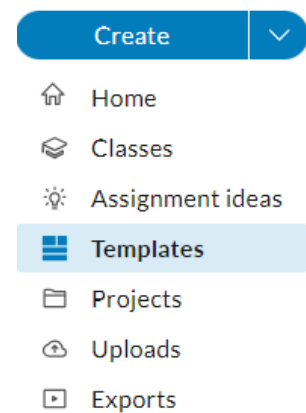




No Prep/ Low Prep WeVideo Ideas
