There are currently 50 states, which are bound together in a union with each other. Each state, including Arizona holds governmental jurisdiction over a defined geographic territory and shares its sovereignty with the United States federal government. Due to the shared sovereignty between each state and the federal government, Americans are citizens of both the federal republic and of the state in which they reside. The United States government, from its very beginnings, was built around representing the fifty states both equally (in the Senate) and proportionally (in the House). This balance of protecting the interests of smaller states while also listening to the majority has had lasting impacts on the U.S. system of government.



A U.S. state is one of the states of the United States of America. Four states (Kentucky, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, and Virginia) are officially named a "Commonwealth" rather than a "State." The earliest state became one on January the second, 1788, and the latest, Hawaii on August the twenty-first, 1959. The U.S.A. has something for everyone; tropical jungles, subtropical and temperate savannas, searing deserts, Mediterranean-like coast lines, frozen mountain peaks, coniferous forests, steamy subtropical river systems, and more. During the late 16th and 17th centuries, multiple European nations began colonizing the North American

continent. Spain, France, Great Britain, the Netherlands, Sweden, and Russia established colonies in various parts of present day continental United States. Of those early settlements, it was the original British colonies in Virginia and Massachusetts that formed the cultural, political, legal and economic core of what is now the United States.

Which state flag is not a rectangle? Ohio. The state flag of Ohio is a swallowtail flag and it was officially adopted in 1902. What animal occupies the state flag of California? The grizzly bear. Grizzlies may have been on the minds of early American settlers since they were a major threat. The Union Jack inhabits the top corner of the Hawaiian flag whose eight stripes signify the eight major islands.

Over the years, states have tweaked their flags with some going as far as to commission complete overhauls. Others have kept the same logo since the mid 19th Century. Some are riffs on Old Glory, many are simply the state seal on a solid background and others are confounding in their lack of artistic attention. The flags of the U.S. states, territories, and federal district exhibit a variety of regional influences and local histories, as well as different styles and design principles. Nonetheless, the majority of the <u>state flags</u> share the same design pattern consisting of the state seal superimposed on a monochrome background, commonly every different shade of blue.

Most state flags in the United States were adopted near the end of the 19th century and in the first few decades of the 20th century. Some of the flags were designed by the state government to meet that need for a flag, and many of those designs feature the state's seal on a dark blue field. Many Southern states preferred to adopt flags that represented the state or its soldiers during the Civil War. Some of those flags have been replaced in recent years, but just as many of them remain in use.

Differences of opinion regarding the slavery of Africans and African Americans ultimately led to the American Civil War. The primary catalyst for secession was slavery, most immediately the political battle over the right of Southerners to bring slavery into western territory that had hitherto been free under the terms of the Missouri Compromise or while part of Mexico. Another factor for secession and the formation of the Confederacy, was white Southern nationalism.

Having a well designed flag gives residents a visual symbol to rally behind. It is a unifying icon that represents large diverse groups of people. Great state flag designs are seen not just on the capitol building but on homes, walls, cars and license plates. Sports teams might even incorporate it into their branding. More than half of U.S. state flags feature a blank field (majority blue) with some sort of detailed state seal in the center. Each state in the U.S. has a designated flag that reflects its culture and values. The design for every flag is not just a representation of the state, but also its citizens. The choice of colors and specific elements used in the flags have been be carefully thought over.
