- ii. Earmarked Money \$1000.00 Total:
  - 1. Memorial Bench: \$600.00 has been ordered & will arrive in 2-4 weeks
  - 2. Memorial stone and engraved leaves: \$400.00 Traci is collecting information, three leaves will be ordered for the three garden members who passed away.
  - -BANG is asking us to use our credit card or PayPal so that we have a better accounting of what we spend; Traci explains that the grant from City Councilmember Laurie Cumbo means that we need to keep a paper trail and so cash should not be used if possible.

  - ii. Leaf Drop, the compost team's annual leaf collection, will begin next month! We will need volunteers to help scout out leaves in the neighborhood and possibly shred leaves.
