The Wi-Fi was used by 60 unique clients in the month of November – with the average number per day being 5. On November 18, there was an above average usage for a Wednesday. Bandwidth usage was 668% higher than the last ten Wednesdays recorded. Through interlibrary loan, we loaned 266 items and received 79 items. We registered three new patrons, with the total number of people registered at 1749.

Collection Development

So far this month, we have added 93 adult books, 5 young adult books, 25 children's books, no audiobook, no DVDs and 31 e-books to the Overdrive collection. We discarded 39 adult book, 3 young adult books, 7 children's books, no audiobook, 9 DVDs, and no magazines.
