

Q. On the class website there is a section for "Thoughts on Discussion" that links you to a google doc. Is this something you want us to complete for each module? And is this just a place to recommend changes to the discussion format or questions?

A. 'Thoughts on discussion' is a document where I summarize and respond to the Yellowdig discussion for each week and/or module. I've changed the name to 'Discussion summary' to make this more clear.

Q. I just wanted to confirm what we have to do from the discussion posts each week. In the introduction video you say to answer one question from each category for each discussion post, but on the google doc on the class website it says to do category 1 for one post and category 2 for another depending on your name. I just wanted to clarify what is expected for these discussion posts, and whether or not we should be answering all of the questions from a category for each post.

The yellowdig discussion runs from 12:01 Sunday AM (basically Saturday at midnight) through 12:01 Sunday AM (basically Saturday at midnight).

The quiz for the first module of each week opens on Monday morning (12:01 AM) and closes on Friday night (11:59pm) and the quiz for the second module of each week opens on Wednesday morning (12:01 AM) and closes on Sunday night (11:59pm).
