PROSE OR POETRY INTERPRETATION

Option 1: Interpreters present one or more **prose** selection(s) from one short story, novella, or novel.

Option 2: Interpreters present one or more **poems** unified by poet, theme, character, and/or subject.

An oral interpretation must be delivered from a typed manuscript. This manuscript is typically in a three-ring binder. The literature selected must be published and of literary worth. Interpreters may choose either prose or poetry, but not both. The selection(s) may be either serious or humorous, but selections from plays, monologue books, and children's literature are not prose or poetry. A brief, well-crafted, rehearsed, and creative introduction must be included, noting the title(s) and writer(s) of the material to be performed, and the theme that will be developed. Interpreters may choose to include transitions between selections. Interpreters should focus on communicating their material to the audience in its intellectual, emotional, and aesthetic entirety with suggestive movement only. No crosses, sitting, kneeling, or other large bodily movements are permitted in oral interpretation. Gestures, facial expressions, and movements from waist-up are appropriate and encouraged. Characters should be created with clear physical and vocal variations.
