SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) is a federally-funded program administered as the replacement for Food Stamps. Benefits are provided on an electronic card that is used like an ATM card and accepted at most grocery stores and farmers markets. M - F 8 am - 5 pm

TANF (Temporary Assistance to Needy Families) is a state block grant program providing cash assistance to eligible families. The receipt of TANF cash assistance is limited to 60 months in an adult's lifetime. Promotes job preparation and work for those who have low or very low income and are under-employed (working for very low wages), unemployed or about to become unemployed. M - F 8am - 5pm.

Double Snap Dollars (DSD)

→ The DSD program focuses on SNAP recipients' access to fresh, local food. The DSD Program allows SNAP recipients to come to the Farmers' Markets in Whitefish and Kalispell to use their SNAP card for the purchase of farm fresh food fruits and vegetables. Weekly, participants can match up to \$30 for \$30 in SNAP funds to use on fresh produce. So, if participants use \$30 of SNAP funds, you can leave the market with \$60 worth of goods.

Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program

→ The SFMNP program offers booklets worth \$48 to Flathead County residents, 60 years of age and older, and are low income (185% FPL), to spend on a Montana-grown fruits, vegetables, and raw honey.

School Coins

→ The School Coins program offers one \$5 coin per market season to any local, school-aged child to purchase whatever fresh produce or plant that produces food that they would like at the Kalispell, Whitefish, or Columbia Falls Farmers Markets.

Food Rx

→ The Food Rx program partners with local Logan Health clinics in the Flathead Valley to provide low-income community members living with chronic health conditions the opportunity to receive an abundance of fresh produce. Contact Land to Hand or your provider to see if your location participates.

Kid/Student Meals Assistance

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Free Summer Meals
