LTELs are students who have been enrolled in U.S. schools for 6 years who have not met English proficiency standards.

4:00	Elementary Highlights	Kim Williams Gretchen Sullivan
		Gretchen shared feedback from her students. Students are engaged with the elementary curriculum. She shared photos of students working in their small groups. All activities are very connected and interacted.
		Kim shared the success of the ELD program at Tassajara Hills. Students have made significant gains. They have seen a higher rate of reclassification as well as a decrease in chronic absenteeism.

	Activity	Small groups read through student reflections from secondary students. They recorded the themes that ran through the reflections. Some of the themes included: a sense of belonging,

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		feeling safe, feeling connected to peers and teachers, improved reading and writing skills.
