1. Do you tend to be a trusting type, or are you more suspicious about other people? Why?

Reflecting on the Passage

- 1. Read Ephesians 6:10-24 aloud. What words, phrases or ideas catch your attention or raise a question for you?
- 2. What did Paul say to exhort his readers? (v. 10)
- 3. Why do Christians need to put on the armor of God? (vss. 11-12)
- 4. Which pieces of armor are more defensive and which are more offensive?
- 5. What does it mean to pray "in the Spirit"? (v. 18)
- 6. Why did Paul tell the Ephesians to pray for him? (vss. 19-20)
- 7. Who took Paul's letter to the Christians in Ephesus? (v. 21)
- 8. What did Paul say in benediction? (v. 24)

Reflecting on your Life

- 9. What from this passage can you use to 1) encourage a believer or, 2) share the gospel with an unbeliever?
- 10. How often are you engaged in spiritual warfare?
- 11. In the sermon, Pastor Paul said that God's word is a "performative word." It doesn't just inform, it also performs what it says. In what ways have you experienced God's Word "doing what it says" in your life?
- 12. In Ephesians 3:18, Paul says to pray "with all prayer and supplication." What experiences have you had in different ways of praying that have broadened your understanding of prayer? (for example: written prayer, call and response prayer, meditative prayer, praying the psalms, Adoration-Confession-Thanksgiving-Supplication format of praying, or others)

- 14. What similarities and differences do you see between Eph. 6:10-20 and Isaiah 59:17?
