Is Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) available in Australia?

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) remains available in Australia through a new multi-dose KwikPen presentation. This pre-filled pen contains the same dosage options as previous vials: 2.5 mg, 5 mg, 7.5 mg, 10 mg, 12.5 mg and 15 mg. It addresses supply shortages while ensuring consistent availability for patients.

How much does Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) cost?

The average Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) Australia cost starts at AUD\$395 per month. This price typically includes the initial and follow-up doses.

As for the Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) KwikPen Australia price, it's approximately AUD\$735 for a 15 mg dose under a private prescription. Similarly, the KwikPen Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) 7.5 mg price is approximately AUD\$585 under a private prescription. Lastly, the KwikPen Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) 2.5 mg price is approximately AUD\$425 under a private prescription.

Costs may vary depending on dosage requirements and treatment frequency, making it important to consult with a doctor for accurate pricing based on individual needs.

How does Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) work?

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) (a brand name for tirzepatide) is a peptide that works by supporting those with type 2 diabetes, enhancing their body's natural insulin response in the first and second insulin secretion phases. In addition to this, it lowers glucagon levels and strengthens insulin sensitivity.

While Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) diabetes treatment or tirzepatide drug therapy is sought out for blood sugar control, this drug can also moderate the speed of gastric emptying, potentially leading to longer satiation and a lower overall food intake.^{[1][2]}

How do you take Mounjaro (Tirzepatide)?

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) comes as a single-dose pre-filled pen for injection.^[3] To understand how to take Mounjaro (Tirzepatide), keep in mind that this medication is administered subcutaneously in the abdomen, thigh or upper arm. Injections can be taken at any time of day, with or without food. Rotate injection sites with each dose to avoid irritation.

Regardless of the dose or efficacy needed, begin by thoroughly going through the instructions for use and the accompanying medication guide. Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) is usually injected once weekly.

This information is supplementary, and you should always keep a line of communication with your doctor regarding your health condition and treatments.

- 1. **Deciding on the injection area.** Areas with fat under the skin, such as your abdomen, thighs or upper arm, are some possible areas for injection. If you need assistance, someone else can administer the injection. Keep varying the injection areas weekly, and be sure to choose a different injection placement when returning to an injection area.
- 2. **Preparing the pen.** Start by pulling off the grey base cap. Ensure the pen remains locked until you're ready to administer the injection.

- 3. **Administering injection.** Clean the skin with an alcohol wipe prior to injection. Place the clear base against your skin and unlock the pen. Afterwards, press and hold the purple button for up to ten seconds. You'll hear two clicks, signifying the start and completion of the injection.
- 4. Handling disposal. After usage, responsibly dispose of the pen in a sharps container.

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) injection vials are currently unavailable in Australia until 31 August 2025 due to supply shortages. Patients can access the medication through the multi-dose KwikPen alternative. Consult your doctor to reassess your treatment plan and ensure uninterrupted care.

The Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) KwikPen is also compatible with ISO 11608-2 compliant pen needles from brands such as BD, Novo Nordisk and Terumo. Available needle sizes include lengths of 4 mm, 5 mm, 6 mm, 8 mm and 12.7 mm and gauges of 29G, 31G, 32G, 33G and 34G. Consult your doctor for compatibility confirmation.

Who can take Mounjaro (Tirzepatide)?

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) can generally be taken by adults with type 2 diabetes mellitus for glycemic control. [4][5]

Individuals looking up terms like '<u>semaglutide Australia</u>' and '<u>Ozempic online</u>' or perhaps even '<u>metformin Australia</u>' for glucose level management might also look into Mounjaro (Tirzepatide). Consult your doctor to see if Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) is advisable for your specific needs.

Side effects of Mounjaro (Tirzepatide)

Common Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) side effects include nausea, diarrhea, decreased appetite, vomiting, constipation, indigestion and stomach pain. While these symptoms are typically mild, patients should consult their doctor if side effects persist or worsen. Always follow medical advice when using Mounjaro (Tirzepatide). ^{6]}

Speak to your doctor if these symptoms persist or if you experience more severe problems, such as:

- Pancreatitis. There have been reports of acute pancreatitis in Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) users. It's
 essential to monitor for persistent upper abdominal pain and discontinue Mounjaro (Tirzepatide)
 if pancreatitis is suspected.
- Hypersensitivity reactions. Some individuals may experience severe reactions, such as
 angioedema and anaphylaxis. If you've had a previous reaction to Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) or a
 GLP-1 receptor agonist then your doctor may consider a different medication.
- **Kidney and gastrointestinal concerns.** Gastrointestinal reactions from Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) can sometimes lead to dehydration, which might result in kidney issues.

 Thyroid C-cell tumours. While Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) has shown tumour development in rodents, its effect on human thyroid cells remains undetermined. However, those with a history of certain thyroid conditions, like medullary thyroid carcinoma (MTC), should be closely monitored.^[7]

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) and other medications

When a patient pairs Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) with insulin secretagogues like sulfonylureas or insulin itself, there's a heightened risk of hypoglycemia. That's why it's crucial for patients to familiarise themselves with the symptoms and signs of hypoglycemia so they may communicate with their doctor for an adjustment of medication if necessary.

Always remember that navigating medication can be intricate, but with the right information, you're empowered to manage your health effectively. Stay connected with your doctor for personalised advice on the short-term or long-term use of Mounjaro (Tirzepatide).

Medicines you should not use with Mounjaro (Tirzepatide)

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) affects gastric emptying, which can influence the absorption of oral drugs taken alongside it. If you're on medicines that require a specific dosage for effectiveness, such as warfarin or digoxin, it's important to keep a close watch when using Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) simultaneously.

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) reduces the exposure of the oral contraceptive pill (OCP). This is clinically important when Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) is taken with other medications that may reduce exposure of the OCP. If this is the case, your doctor should discuss alternative contraception options such as barrier contraception, Implanon or Mirena. Additionally, there have been cases of acute kidney injury in patients using GLP-1 receptor agonists. This may also lead to hemodialysis due to deteriorating chronic renal failure. [8]

Can I get Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) over the counter?

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) is not available over the counter in Australia. It is a prescription-only medication requiring consultation with a licenced doctor. Patients should seek medical advice for suitable alternatives if prescription medications are not an option.

Can a GP prescribe Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) in Australia?

In Australia, doctors can prescribe Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) for treating type 2 diabetes, obesity or being overweight. This approval by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) allows GPs to provide tailored treatments under medical supervision.

Can I claim Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) on private health?

Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) is only available via private prescription in Australia. Some private health insurance policies may partially reimburse the cost, depending on your extras cover. Check with your insurer to confirm eligibility and rebate details.

Now, for those searching 'Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) Australia cost PBS', take note that the medication is not currently listed on Australia's Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS), meaning patients must pay the full cost. In contrast, PBS-listed alternatives like Ozempic (Semaglutide) cost between AUD\$8 and AUD\$35 per month for eligible patients.
