Classes will be held Monday thru Friday.

Classes for current year grades 4K through 4th will be held at Lake Superior Elementary.

Classes for current year grades 5th through 12th will be held at the Ashland High School.

AHS Summer School - Credit Recovery

Ashland High School offers a summer session for 9-12 grade students to recover credits toward graduation.

If your student received a grade of I or F as a semester grade this year*, or any previous year of high school, they can pick up a HS Summer Session Application from their School Counselor/The Student Services Office. The application requires teacher approval, student & guardian signatures, and an administrator's signature. Once completed, it will be turned in to Ms. Tody in Student Services or Mrs. Prater (rm 212) to register for the summer session.

Dates: June 15th - July 17th

Where: Room 212, "The Marina" at AHS

Times: 8:00 - 11:30 am &/or 12:00 - 3:30 pm

With teacher approval students may:

- Finish an incomplete semester/course
- Retake a credit recovery version of the semester/course
- Make up work to reinstate WIAA eligibility for the Fall of 2026*

Credit is earned by attendance (time) and work completion. Each student's time requirement will be determined by the number of courses they are attempting to complete. The five-week (five days per week) schedule provides enough time for a student to retake two semester-long courses; which is up to 1.0 credit. Students finishing incomplete courses may be able to recover more than 1.0 credit because they are not retaking full semester courses.

*If your student participates in Fall WIAA activities and received a grade of I or F for term 4, and would like to reinstate their WIAA eligibility, they can also pick up a HS Summer School Application from their School Counselor/The Student Services Office.

- Children should **not** arrive before **7:45 a.m.**
- There is no adult supervision indoors or outside before this time.

 - (unless noted differently in the Summer School catalog)

- Grade levels in catalog are the **current year (not next year's) grade level, (ie, if your child just completed 1st grade, they would still be considered a 1st grade student for Summer School).**
- Weekly Summer School classes start at 8:15 until 3:20
 - Full day includes:
 - 25 minute recess between periods
 - 70 minute combination recess & lunch period
 - Elementary - Choose 1 Package per week to build your student(s) summer school schedule (Each package is considered full day/full week)
 - **MS/HS** - Choose from 4 classes per week to build your student(s) summer school schedule (These are not packages, they are individual class selections).
- All fees **must** be paid on or before the last day of registration-Friday, May 15th at 4:00 pm.

General Guidelines and Procedures

Class sizes are limited and will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

Some class sizes will not be able to be increased due pre-purchased supplies

Some classes will not be able to allow 'last minute' enrollments due to pre-purchased supplies.

Classes are open to all School District of Ashland students.

Unless there is a supply fee for consumable materials there is no cost for district residents.

Out-of-district resident fees are \$50 per class plus any special materials fee if applicable.

Attendance:

Except for emergencies, students are expected to attend all summer school classes. This program is funded through a formula that is based upon student attendance. If the student is not able to attend in the event of an emergency or illness, parents should contact the school office at 715-682-7089 by 8:00 a.m.

Students are expected to attend all of their summer school classes for the entire scheduled class time, so please schedule family vacations and other events accordingly. Students who do not come to the first and second day of class are automatically taken off the enrollment. Students are automatically dropped from summer school after the third absence. If your students decide not to attend, please contact Cheryl Tody at 715-682-7089 so that we can open up the class for others to attend.

SUMMER SCHOOL CLASS INFORMATION:

Class Cancellations: All classes/packages are tentative; contingent on staffing and enrollment. At the end of the enrollment period, if a class/package does not meet the minimum enrollment, all students in the class will be enrolled in a class/package that has space available and in a similar subject. Also, at the end of the second day of summer school, if a class does not have the minimum enrollment it will be canceled. Parents will be contacted if the class/package is canceled.

● **Location/Room Assignments:**

- **Lake Superior Elementary** for all current year grades 4K through 4th.
- **Ashland High School** for all current year grades 5th through 12th.

Materials: If applicable, are listed with each class description. Individual teachers may request additional supplies for the class and will notify you.

- **Registration:** Registration is online for all classes. Please read guidelines for this process which is provided in a separate section entitled “**Registration Information**”. **Registration dates are Tuesday, April 28th at 4:00 pm through Friday, May 15th at 4:00 pm.**

GENERAL INFORMATION AND EXPECTATIONS:

Cell phones: Students may possess cell phones while they are in summer school, but the telephones must be turned off and out of sight during class sessions unless the teacher is incorporating them into the class. They may be used at the start and end of the school day.

Student Conduct: Students are expected to follow the same school rules and standards of conduct which apply during the regular school year. Summer school staff will contact parents if behavior issues occur in the classroom, hallways, outside, etc. If problems continue, the student may be removed from the class and may lose the privilege of attending any summer school classes. There is no suspension, detention or in-school suspension during summer school.

The following behavior expectations supersede the regular school year policies and will result in automatic dismissal from summer school: Possession of any smoking or drug paraphernalia including cigarettes, rolling papers, lighters, etc. Swearing at a teacher or walking out of class. Any illegal activity including harassment or discrimination

Student Dress: Students are expected to dress appropriately for summer school, no swimwear or any other apparel which would detract from the learning environment. Students are required to wear shoes/sandals at all times. Hats are to be worn outside only.

Supervision: Please note that we will not have any supervision available to watch children if they are not participating in a class.

Transportation: The district does not provide transportation for its summer school program. Transportation of students to and from summer school is the responsibility of the parents/guardians. Students must be picked up immediately upon their final dismissal each day. Supervision is not available for students remaining after their last class.

Prescription and Non-Prescription Medications: If your child requires [prescription](#) or [non-prescription medication](#), during Summer School, please fill out the appropriate forms and return to Cheryl Tody at the time of check-in at Summer School.

Additional Information

- If "Add New" is not next to the package/class you want to register your student in, it means the class is not available.
- If there is a conflict between the packages/classes you will receive an error message.
- Classes fill on a first-come first-serve basis. When a class is full, it will close. There are no wait-lists. Please check back on-line, as sometimes students will cancel.
- If a package/class is canceled you will be notified and your child will be moved to another package/class for their grade level.

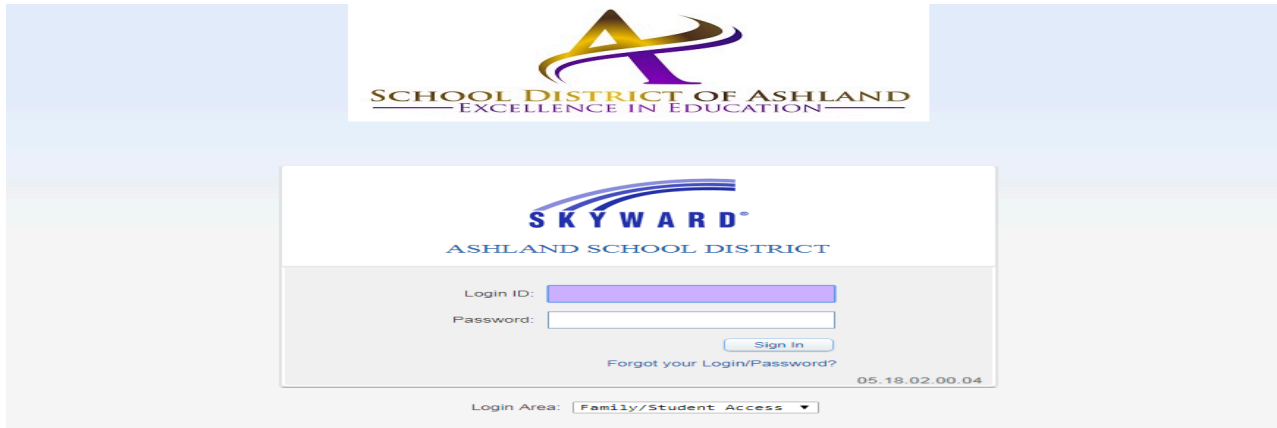

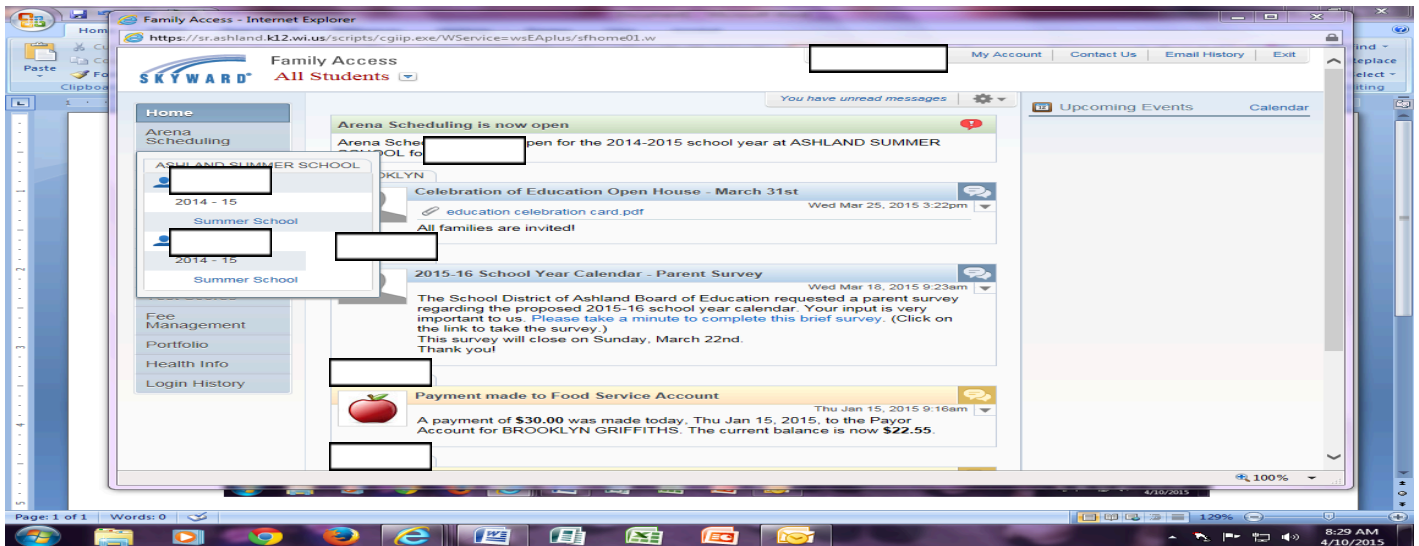

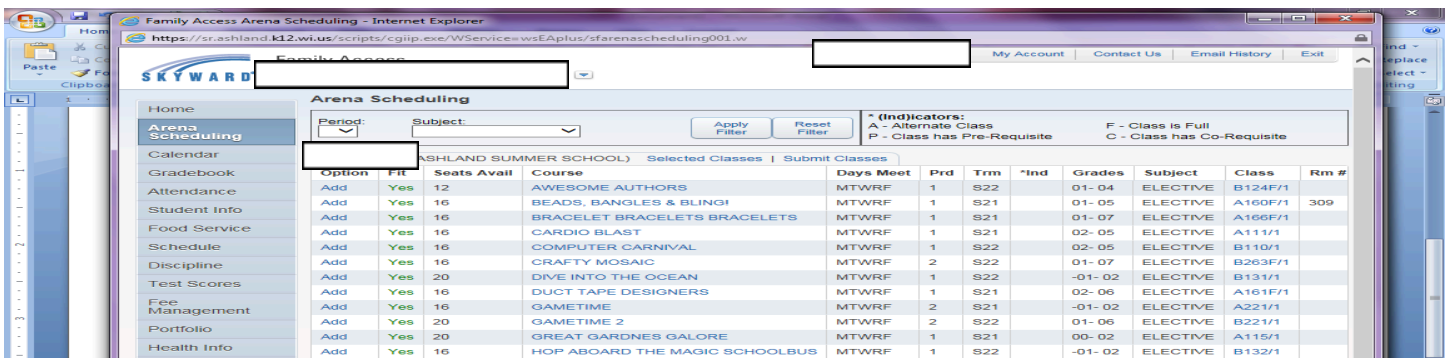
Type in your Skyward Family Access Login and Password (if you do not know your login and password you can call your child's school and talk to the schools administrative assistant.

- Click on Arena Scheduling

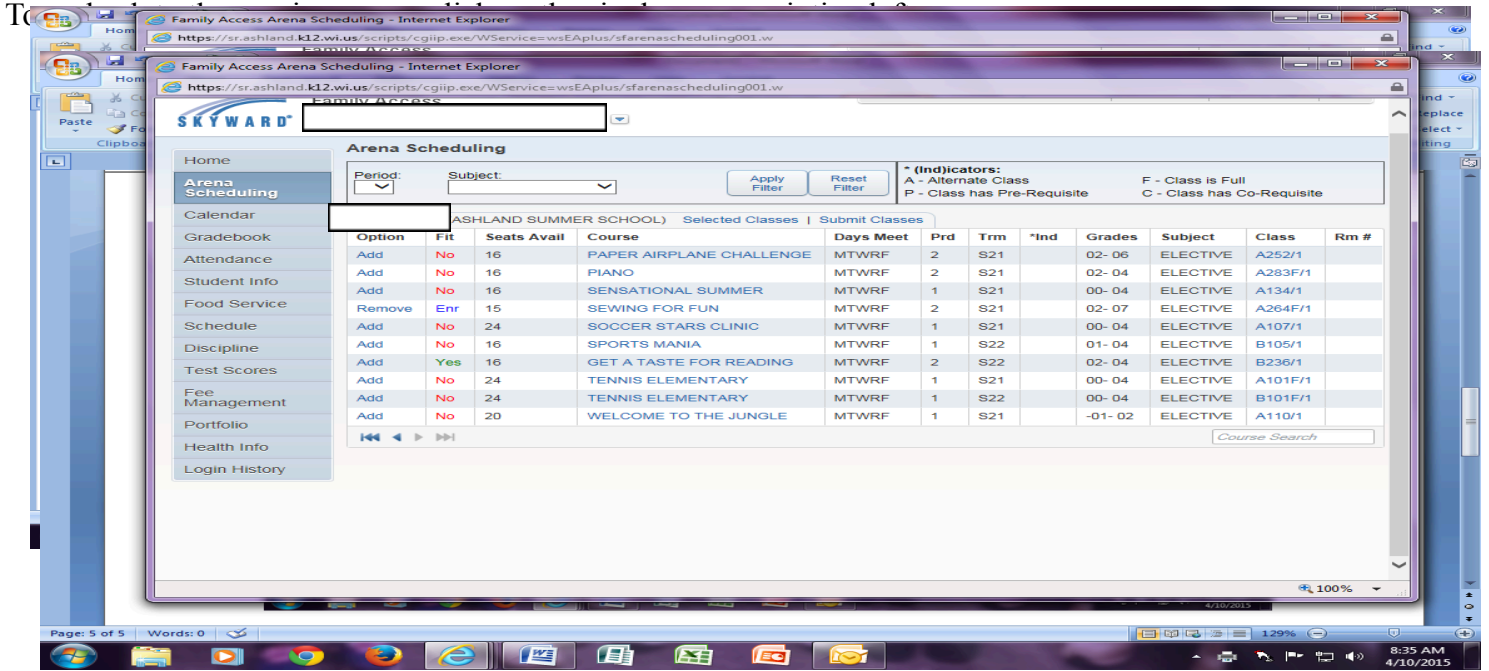


- Click on Summer School for the student you are enrolling into summer school classes.

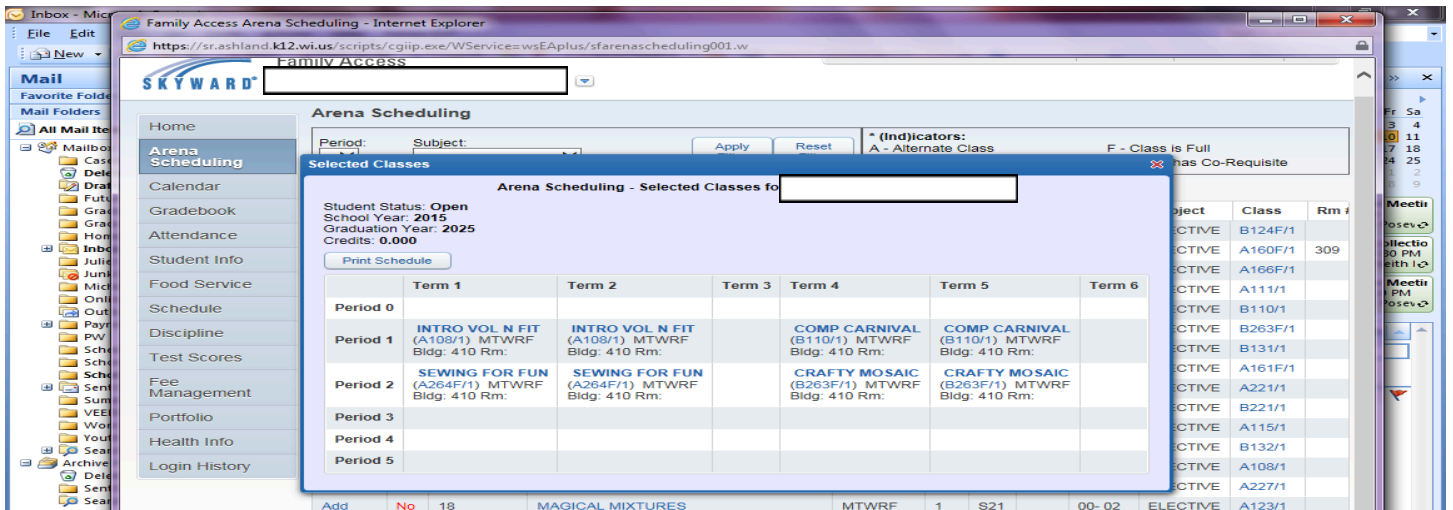
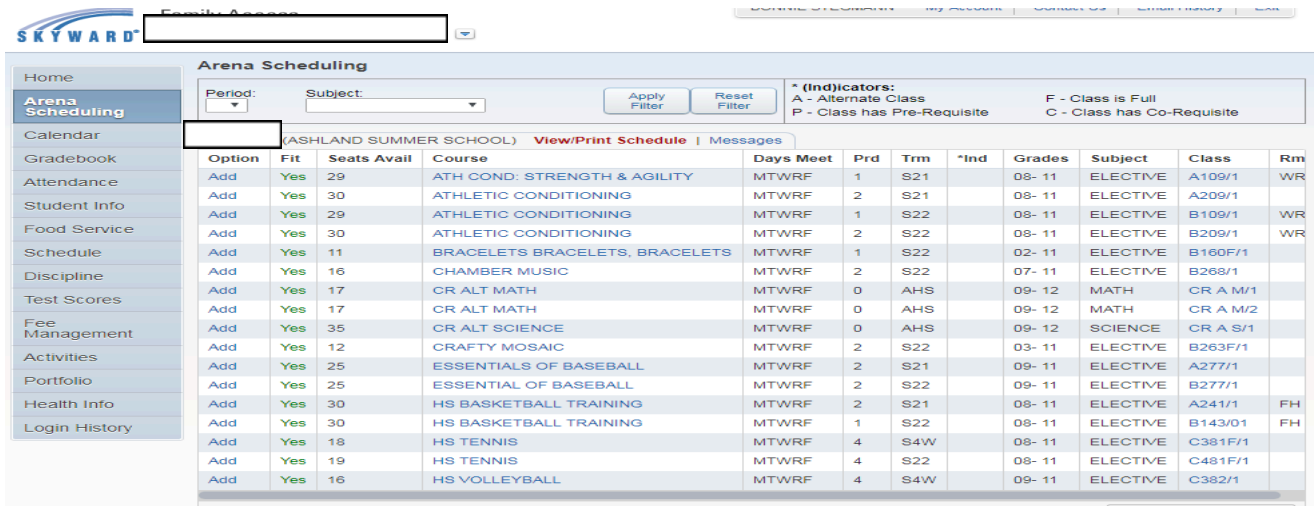
- Click on ADD next to the package/class you would like to enroll your student into.

Summer School Classes

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

****Class descriptions are general descriptions and may vary from week to week or class to class.**
