Conference Summary:

Keynote Speaker, **Barbara Coloroso** - many free online resources at http://www.kidsareworthit.com/

Education Minister Demetrios Nicolaides spoke and held a Q and A. Takeaways:

- a provincial survey took place for parents to provide views regarding cellphone use in schools. This was open until May 3. Gov't is questioning whether a provincial policy is needed.
- Budget 9.3 billion for the Education Ministry (450 million increase). 98 school building projects are in the works in Alberta with 43 going ahead. Fastest growing province in Canada and a lot of enrollment pressures. 1.5 billion to support specialised learning needs.
- Questions from the floor regarding: 2-year pilot project funding for mental health coming to an end, decreased PUFF funding, concern across the province regarding children watching TV at lunch, playground funding (some schools have NO playground because communities are not in a position to fundraise for this), request for feedback regarding ASCA resolutions.

Justice Hancock from Alberta Court of Justice spoke

Breakout sessions offered for attendees. I attended topics related to School Council basics. Lots of good learning!! My main takeaway:

- Continue to re-evaluate ways to increase parent engagement (in particular for those who can't attend meetings)?
