Text analysis...

Capitalism serves capital, not people. It is inherently unequal. Markets are good for efficiency and good for growth, but they **care** not a bit **about** who gets what.

- To care about
- A bit= a little
 - More British.. Perfectly correct.
 - More American... they do not care about who gets what.

*Contractions are more informal-- writing.

**I recommend English learners not to use contractions until they have good pronunciation.

I often like to compare capitalism to the roulette table at a casino; even if everyone starts out with the same number of chips, as the wheel spins, some stacks of chips grow and others diminish and, if the game goes on long enough, one person finishes up with everything. In fact, the roulette table is much fairer than capitalism; everyone has an equal chance, luck rules, and the growing and shrinking piles of chips are the result of the accumulation of unbiased luck. In market capitalism, the rich get better chances, and better rates of return, so it is harder for winners ever to lose, or for losers ever to win.
