

The content within the primary headings that will be added to. The “Home” and About Us” sections are unlikely to receive additions to their content from contributors. Use this for deciding where each piece of material should go. Also use these broad guidelines for deciding how to proceed with editing older collection pages. If a source doesn't fit into its original area, but fits into another section (e.g. a general source linked into a more specialized area), attempt to relocate it to the relevant area rather than delete it.

- Theory: Librarian related theory. Primarily this section has resources relating to difficulties mainly facing librarians, such as collection development, acquisition, and collection policies.
- Major Collections: The primary area for resources of each field. Extra fields that need resources may be added as necessary.
- Type of Library: Different types of library. Specific resources are developed for each library type, listed under the individual library name.
- Tools and Tutorials: Resources for varied use. These include information aimed at educators, students, and librarians.
- Issues: Problems and difficulties within the library. They vary from diversity, equality, and inclusion problems and collection related problems.
- Mental Health in the Library: Resources describing and suggesting ways that libraries can help and serve those struggling with mental health trouble.

To keep the additions clean, here are a few listed guidelines for the project.

1. Keep general resources contained to the relevant section. If a general source has a specialized section that corresponds with one of the areas in the “Major Collections”, note so in the description and make sure that the link leads to the relevant area rather than the main page.
2. For written documents, use double spacing and 12 pt Times New Roman font (not out of preference, but for uniform readability within the documents).
3. When creating titles, if possible use the title of the document. Meanwhile, for descriptions, attempt to keep them relatively brief to improve readability for users.
4. Make sure to test any URLs you add.
