

## **Discovering Synergy**

We've discussed "What is the Occupy message?" and "What is our vision for Occupy 2.0?" Over time, the range of topics has blossomed to a wide array of different points, but no single frame that welcomes everyone. The purpose of this interview is to discover synergy and surface stories and information that will help us identify topics for a broader inquiry in which we can engage the world in discovery, dream, design, and destiny.

"Affirmative Topic" and "Change Agenda" Framing:

- "If you had to have a sentence or phrase that captured what we want to inquire into, what might that be?"
- What are ways of talking about the "new economy" in language which is accessible to all--so the new eclipses the old. How about "an economy that works for all?"
- What could we catalyze? What would the whole world resonate with? What declaration of possibility might we make? "What is our change agenda with this mass-mobilized inquiry?"

#### **Action Steps:**

- Produce a new interview guide
  - Develop the process for testing the new guides
    - could interview people in our own communities especially those who aren't part of Occupy
  - Convene a Design Team to work on this. Drawn from the movement and also Al world.
- Widen the circle of interviews

  - Use the Al structure for on the ground cafes

Tony: intersection with sense of American Dream: self reliance vs hiring people to do technical things. Now need interdependence.

Rob: the topic of catalyzing the emergence of an economy that works for all is fine but should also include providing good opportunities and well-being for all

Also, include: how could we create a Sustainable Community, America, and world through developing a national and local strategies for Sustainability and with this provide access to millions of much needed new jobs and provide prosperity and well being for all?

And: What is the most important legislation that the Occupy Movement could endorse and support to fix our broken political system and create a more effective democracy? How could we develop an effective educational/advocacy and action campaign to support these type of changes?

Richard: assigning tasks, mission statement and know what purpose and individual function is: focusing so are organized at all levels and throughout so that win hearts and minds and support of public and politicians

Iwanka: dealing with the police and current structures have been challenging. Need to use Acts of Random Violence with the police. They cannot differentiate between peaceful people and those interested in terrorism and how to cause harm. They treat everyone the same.

Occupiers could sit with linked arms, instead can get up and leave roses where we were sitting. We could leave cards with personal notes of thanks and appreciation for services the cops are providing to our communities.

Police have to work two jobs to get social security, etc. Thus we need to address issues that are important to them.

Ask police: you are supposed to be security, but if they don't follow orders they loose their jobs - where is their security?

The policeman at OWS from Philly was told he will lose his pension if he wears his uniform at Occupations again.

Read that 17% think they are a part of the 1%. We need to include in our conversations even the high income leaders and we will protect them even when they don't have wealth for security. Need to provide security without money.

Iwanka: Have a Mayor's campaign asking where's our Xmas cards because we have stimulated the economy, given a lot of overtime, and helped create more money for city services.

Tony: police psychology call at 8 pm Eastern tonight. 712-432-9945

Tony: if a worker owned cooperative had a position open in your field, would you consider applying?

Rob: or an ecovillage community

David Finestone: People don't understand how they are under other people's thumb. This situation is not benefitting you. Make them aware of how things are syphoned away

from them. Local community bank vs credit card at 30% interest rates. Most people think if it is not broken don't fix it.

Tony: people think they are self sufficient if they have a job and can pay their bills; but it is paternalistic but can disappear easily and leave you without security and sufficiency

David: create an infrastructure locally that we think we have nationally

Rob: Similarly if we focus on the need to create sustainable communities and America then people will begin to realize how unsustainable our current system is and what many of the changes are that need to be made.

Peter: theatres will let you do free screenings and we can do hour films that explain this easily. Materials have already been created, be prepared to answer the questions.

All cars running on gasoline will run on alcohol. any flexi fuel will run on it. how about using hydrogen. and can learn how to set up a still on the internet. People need to learn and know this is what you can do.

get inquiry going, and how we can build a new economy that allows sustainability and for how the world can support us. And then look at how people are already doing these things.

Jack: How we can create a global permaculture world and process and get them together with occupiers. And bring occupiers into ecovillage communities.

If there was monetary support maybe we could tour ecovillage people and occupiers around to visit and learn from each other.

Rob: I am a UN representative for the Global Ecovillage Network and know many of the Board Members. We could invite a couple of ecovillage people to host a call or series of calls on ecovillage practices and living and permaculture on Occupy Cafe. If anyone really wants to work on this please contact me. One key person would be Albert Bates that runs the Ecovillage Training Center at The Farm in Tennessee. The Farm was and still basically is just an Occupation in a rural community. One of the original early occupations of the Occupy Movement. #### 1st question

- ?: Create a more beautiful world that we know can happen
  - look at new ways to create "wealth"
    - many forms
    - this movement has the power to re-frame how we perceive capital / value
    - step out of the box , money doesn't constitute the only form of capital

- Rhys: to catalyze this we need to change as individuals on a massive scale
  - change how we think about we work together
  - change how we look at money

    - the institutions control currency and we need to understand that it has no value so we can stop chasing it

  - as social animals we don't like to change our habits; we get comfortable following the path we've already established, mimicking each other

    - the problem = global; we can meet everyone's concern: but first we need to **listen** to each other

- Tristan: Yes! Magazine: Time for a New Theory of Money
- Lenny: a disconnect exists between those who struggle to thrive and those who tell them how to do so.
  - we need to overthrow the entire institutional mindset
  - don't work with the things already out there, we need something fundamentally new
  - how can we appreciate each others different beliefs? i enjoy provoking others so I can listen to what they say. I have problems connecting with groups because I try to think creatively. I don't watch TV, I try to apply science and reason. (sometimes belief and spirituality is necessary)
  - we can get the whole movement behind working toward new forms of participatory media
    - by taking existing entertainments and framing them educationally
- John: we could speak in ways that the average person can readily internalize
  - o confused re: meaning of the guestion
    - Might the topic of "catalyzing the emergence of an economy that works for all?" do this?
  - the problem = connecting the smaller rural populations with the rest of the country on these kinds of concepts (value = social effort for example)
  - we could speak in ways that the average person can readily internalize,
     we should try to say things in a way that others can understand
  - trying to restructure a person's cognitive and emotional framework = meaningless / empty / marketing-esque / the same old quest for domination and control
- Doreen: we need to create a space where we realize we have the same goals;
   we're in this together
  - education = important part of this
  - deception + economic manipulation runs deep
  - o people see you as a conspiracy theorist when you try to tell the truth
  - o people [are] fragile! things [are] changing fast and dramatically
  - we need to create a space where we realize we have the same goals, [we're] in this together
  - education helps us understand each other; it makes the things that threaten us, real ... the earth comes before profit
    - think in terms of compassion

Lenny: i found that something we can count on people to do [is] get involved in a

new game, we can introduce new games to get people involved in our movement, we can apply it to / / introduced us, people like World of Warcraft / reach people through unconventional means through entertainment (design an Occupy script for existing games)


- tristan: see google conference on "human processing cycles"
- people like sports and scores
- if we can provide a scoring system similar to what people experience with sports
- 30 percent baseball thing = good but students need a 90
- work toward rewards not competition
- Tristan: conflict with the state = critical tool to expose the violent bullies that hurt us;
   bullies -- really think about that word; predators sounds a little dramatic -- but there exists an unconscious / subterranean violence that we use to explain everything we do. should you even consider quitting your job, or if you get fired, before too long a gang of armed, decorated assholes come to your house and drag your family into the street.
  - o if we can **make the state live up to their threat over and over again** it will demonstrate to everyone who's the aggressor and who's the victim.
  - o right now in Toledo more than enough vacant homes exist to house the homeless. the banks need to keep the homes vacant even though it probably actually [is] in their best interest to have someone maintain the property -- but if they let people enter the homes it threatens the entire logic that they depend on. people do occasionally resist foreclosures directly and occasionally they actually win. but even if they don't win, in a way they still do because they've made the foreclosure process more expensive for the banks. in a week or two Occupy Toledo will cut the bolt and make a key to move a homeless person or family into a vacant foreclosed home. in my appreciative inquiry of participants locally, the image of defending shelter, resisting foreclosures constitutes one of the main life giving forces that bring us together.
  - o if we can cultivate a new morality, where people take pride in their poverty and cast themselves as victims instead of someone who should feel shame -- what i mean [is], when we got foreclosed on, my mom cried, she didn't want anyone to know. I, on the other hand, wanted to tell everyone. I saw injustice and she just felt ashamed of herself. At the time the Toledo Foreclosure Defence League had started to form and I wanted to resist, like Keith Sadler did. If we can cultivate a new morality that involves an ethic of caring instead of competition perhaps more people will defend their homes, perhaps more cops will realize they're responsible for everything they do even if they're taking orders.
  - i apologize for getting more geeked about my manifesto than appreciating what others have written / sa
  - How do we cultivate the passion necessary to sustain our

### attention long enough to "bring things up a notch many

**notches?** I know alot of us consider ourselves pacifist and a few years ago I would never had predicted I'd say this today but after attending a talk by Derrick Jensen ... I got into his idea that ... it seems awfully convenient for those in power, if we adopt as our primary tactic the idea that we as individuals can enlighten ourselves and from that justice will emerge. He called it magical thinking. Nietzsche called it slave morality. But like someone else said in our talk today, the "evil" (for lack of a better word) forces that exploit us will not stop until something forces them. Think about 9/11. Where does that kind of passion come from? I don't want people to hurt, I hate the idea of any kind of suffering in even one person. But the symbolism, of the towers falling, with everything they represented ... I can't deny I felt choked up with excitement especially when I found out one [was] headed for the Pentagon. And the desperation of the people who killed themselves just to do it -- they've [been] hurt -- by Wall Street.

- Rhys: tactics = a matter of psychology, we have an arrogance about paying taxes
  - but if people actually understood it all goes to pay for the national debt, an impossible thing ever finish paying
  - it's rape it's a bully stealing from us
    - i don't pay tax, i wont pay it, they're just stealing it, i get nothing from it
    - the emperor has no clothes
  - the commerce code in law shows how a mortgage = unenforceable contract
    - the bank must provide consideration
    - the money comes from thin air, they willed it into existence, they contributed nothing
    - in court you have to dance with [?]
    - people don't know the real rules to the game
      - get people to realize that they might as well take the money they pay in taxes and burn it
      - you don't need to pay your taxes
        - i don't blame corporations for not wanting to pay tax, why do individuals
  - ?: but how would you make that actionable?
    - education, a game that goes viral, something that demonstrates on a deep level how seriously they're getting screwed
    - people don't understand, people with degrees in finance don't even know how money works
    - exchange affection you said?

- John: i like the idea of alternative forms of communication; like games
  - we could manipulate existing games
  - throughout history music has energized countercultural movements and provoked cultural introspection
    - lately it hasn't demonstrated the full potential it can reach
    - tools / more Internet
      - develop technologies that make it as easy as possible to help smaller communities get involved in the occupy movement
    - facilitate local discussion
      - it needs to start **within** the movement, teach by example, ask questions [ ... economy, culture .. ? ]
      - the Internet helps with this too
- ?: re-focus the mass media on playing an educational role in our lives and empower people
  - o target specific groups perhaps ... leaders, etc.
  - find an entertaining way to get the message across,
    - re: **music**, they've calibrated tones that can create a magnetic field around the body, we have a protective energetic field around us

Vic (I think) wanted a table with a window...

Vic: I am a processor and believe that processing leads to action. And it is important to breathe and take the time to work out processes together.

Melanie: I am an action-oriented person and believe if everyone became World Citizens (worldservice.org) we would raise our level of thinking to include everyone- the whole human race. Before we make any decision we should ask ourselves "Is this good for the world or not?"

Garry: I am involved in a process of world law. World law is the process that is lacking. And because it is lacking it leads to all sorts of injustices...and a chaotic global situation.

Suzanne: I am familiar with what you are talking about but I am not up to date on it.. I am a process person. Out of process comes strategy.

If a handful of people come up with a strategy it is not likely to meet everyone's needs. I work with a process called: non-violent communication—Really listen to what everyone's

needs are. Put everyone's needs on the table so you can make a strategy that meets everyone's needs.

Garry: Before you have process you have to have identity- know who you are at first. When we talk about process we are taking about people who are already identified within a framework. And that framework leads to "What is the code of conduct/process between us? The us has to be first of all- identified.

Vic: The things that come up for me is this whole idea of developing a process that we really don't know about or doing an action that we are not doing yet. And being able to stay conscience and watchful of what I call patterns which is related to identity. Recognizing our old self and being open to the realization of our new selves. It's a very uncomfortable place to be. A lot of people get restless with it especially in such a do society- it is not a be society. Going from a do society to a be society is very challenging. Meditators know a little about relieving the do by going into be. But might enjoy being so much they don't get anything done! And trying to build that dynamic whole between doing and being together

Collaborative design to me is bringing process and action together.

Importance of our connections to realize something greater than ourselves. How do we educate a society that is so ingrained in an old system on linear doing?

Suzanne: In non-violent communication we have found our best movement forward is in what we call a "teachable moment" Basically wait for the person to ask for advice through words or body-language. Have empathy before education. People resist if you just try to offer information. Checking with them if they really want to hear what you want to say.

Vic: I am a big believer in trying to turn information which are statements of facts into questions of inquiry. Very similar to what you are saying.

Suzanne: I guess what I am saying checking with them first- then they will be more likely to hear what you are saying...

Vic: Garry you still there?

Garry: Yes, just listening.

Vic: Four days ago there was 97-3 vote in congress to override the bill of Rights- allowing the army to pick up anyone and put them away forever. How do you bring forward a process for something people don't even know about?

Garry: There is a way to get out of that and it has to do with the 9th amendment of the US constitution.. I challenge you to check it out. It eliminates the rights of the government to do things like that.

Vic: Garry has got this great idea. He is passionate about it. There has to be a process to enable it and turn it into action.

Garry: The action is that we have to claim a higher level of citizenship. That's what the founding fathers did. Well we are not living in the 18th century- we are living in the 21st. We have really major human problems- guns are pointing at everyone now that we are in the nuclear age. So that paradigm shift has to come from each individual. I think I am a classic example of that. I was a bomber pilot in WWII and got fed up with the whole idea. I claimed to be a world citizen at 26 years old.

Suzanne: Did you do that legally?

Garry: We are the beginning of law.

Susan: So you identified yourself a sovereign citizen. And you have been having that identity ever since?

Garry: Yes. Sovereignty means political choice.

Vic: I think it is a powerful subject.

Suzanne: One of the things I love about the non-violence approach is that it assumes human being is a sovereign individual. Always stay in dialogue until all needs are met.

Garry: The first article of the Declaration of Independence is all human beings are born equal in dignity and rights...

Suzanne: The Declaration has given us that right. We have just lost awareness of it over time.

Garry: We should be educated into it. Article 21 say the will of the people should be the basis and authority of government.

Victor: Garry has a good idea but it's easier to see a barn raising than a sketch of a barn-raising.

Garry: I'll give you an example: We have created the World passport- which represents our right to travel on our planet- Article 13-2 of the Declaration of Human Rights. It neutralizes all the frontiers. And I have been traveling with it since 1956 all over the world. We issue it from our offices in Washington. We are in one world. No one has the right to tell us we can't travel on it. The process is in that Declaration of Human Rights.

Suzanne: What is an action we could take in January?

Garry: Occupy Wall St. is occupying cities.... Back in 1939 Cahors registered as world city. And now world cities are all over the world. That is one program... the other program was designed by the great cybertician Stafford Beer- using Bucky Fuller's geodesic dome and he called it the Syntegrity project in which each one of can have a voice in a framework where the questions are asked on a global level.

Suzanne: What would be an action we could take now-starting in January to get this information out to people?

Garry: The first action is to become a World Citizen.

Barbara: We would have to get this info out in a grass roots way- using social networking.

Vic: Garry, why don't you start a group on occupycafe.org?

Melanie: Actually, I've already done that- A group discussing World Citizenship and getting it out there.

Vic: There we go!

Garry: The World Service Authority issues passports, birth certificates, and marriage licenses based on the Declaration of Human Rights. The amazing thing about that declaration is that every member state in the United Nations has signed it.

Vic: I suggest giving people 5 steps they can they so you don't give them too much information.

Suzanne: Start with the basics.

Garry: You can read the book "Passport to Freedom" first.

Suzanne: Melanie, Where is your group on the website- under groups?

Melanie: It is under the group tab at the top of the page. It talks about getting World Citizenship out into the Occupy movement. We are also making movie and feature film about Garry so that will get the word out. Occupy is what is happening now. It is an amazing movement. World Citizenship is coming together as one and that is exactly what Occupy is doing. The websites are <a href="worldservice.org">worldservice.org</a> and <a href="mailto:one">one films.com</a>

Talk about 5 easy steps. If you claim World Citizenship that is a method to expand your brain beyond the nation-state system. It is a system where we just think of ourselves, our own country, our own people. We need to think of the whole world. I think it is critical that we step out into the thinking that we are all in this together. We are all on one little island called Earth. As soon as we do that ... that will help us improve the world.

Suzanne: And putting it on a forum, putting a short really enticing blurb with a link- on the Occupy facebook page. There are tons of Occupy facebooks.

Vic: We have action, but I don't hear a process for bringing it forward.

Suzanne: Vic, when you say putting it on Facebook is not a process- could you explain a little more about that?

Vic: We've got the theme. It's called World Citizenship. It's a theme we want to put action to. We have content experts. What we need to ask questions about "What would it take to get people stimulated and interested in a subject like this? Where is the passion that drives people to move? After they join the facebook group... do we want to create subgroups or movements in towns where they are getting signatures to get their entire city to become World Cities?

Garry: If you claim to be a World Citizen and I claim to be a World Citizen we make a contract with each other. We've said we are going to act in peace with each other.

Vic: I get that and you are educating me but a process would educate more than me.
