Welcome! We are delighted you have chosen to worship with us today. On Palm Sunday we celebrate Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and perform our own march of the palms. This is also the Sunday we are reminded of the sufferings of Christ, and His death upon the cross. This Sunday begins Holy Week where we journey with Christ to his cross on Good Friday and then to the resurrection on Easter Sunday. This week you are invited to walk with our Lord in your mind and heart and as we gather for services to mark the days of Holy week.

Today we greet him as our King, although we know his crown is thorns and his throne a cross. We follow him this week from the glory of the palms to the glory of the resurrection by way of the dark road of suffering and death. United with him in his suffering on the cross, may we share his resurrection and new life.

- A: Assist us mercifully with your help, Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy into the celebration of those mighty acts whereby you give us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Rector's Corner – "You might want to read it" <u>Building a relationship with Jesus, the Christ</u>

"Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18)

Starting a relationship with Jesus is like starting a marriage relationship. At our wedding service, the priest asked me, 'Anthony, will you have Denise as your wife?', and I replied, 'I will.' Then he turned to Denise, saying, 'Denise, will you have Anthony as your husband?', and she replied, 'I will.' At that moment, a new relationship was established. Similarly, at every baptism, God asks, 'Savior, will you have this sinner?', and Jesus always answers, 'I will.' Then God turns to the child, and through the parents and the sponsors, says, 'Sinner, will you have this Savior?', and when the child answers through the parents and sponsors, 'I will', a new relationship begins. If the person being baptized is old enough to speak for himself, the person answers God's question.

Just as we have to work at our marriage relationships, so we need to build on our relationship with Jesus. Becoming a Christian can be summarized in these words: *knowing Jesus personally, and obeying Him.* Living and growing as a Christian can be summed up as in these words: *getting to know Jesus better and better, and obeying him more and more.*

If someone were to come to you and say, 'I am a Christian, but I seem to be standing still; I don't seem to be making any progress,' what would you answer? Take time to work out in your own mind, and perhaps on paper too, how Christians can build on their relationship with Jesus, or grow as Christians. Try to avoid complex jargons, and have biblical references to back up your points.

<u>Prayer</u>: Lord, if there is anyone who needs to hear what I have discovered from your word today, bring us together, and may your Holy Spirit give me humility and courage to share it with that person. Amen!
