

What we have so far:

Short Term Goal: Kickstarter to raise money to buy a single building for us to come and clean up in Detroit.

>>>/k/12369550 and >>>/diy/258526 here. I believe I am the man for the job of establishing our foothold. I have /diy/ experience from my father putting me to work around the house growing up (he built half of it himself, and I assisted him), I am well-versed in urban homesteading, I have community organization connections, I have been homeless (by choice) for years and have lived frugally and resourcefully (and I have been safely homed in a gangland community), I am finishing up an EMT course, and I am a /k/ommando, owning an AMD-65, in the market for a carry pistol, and experienced in various martial arts.

Would you folks respond well to a Kickstarter page for establishing a "house on Paper Street" type facility in Detroit? I could make this happen, and I know plenty of people who would love to help me (tons of

urban gardening friends, survivalists, /diy/nosaurs, /k/omrades, people in real estate and real estate assessment....).

tl;dr: I can build a fairly sustainable /k/ommunity, would I have your support, financial or otherwise?

What I see as a (hastily-crafted) viable plan so far:

We pick out a property, or several adjacent properties, and try to get tax breaks on our "community revitalization project" (pull ideas and language from this sort of thing: http://www.transitionnetwork.org/sites/default/files/TransitionInitiativesPrimer%283%29.pdf)

I finish up my EMT course, take a few more bicycle mechanic classes, and then head out to Detroit with some /Diy/ke /K/ommandos.

We establish gardens on our property, fence it in. Our gardens established, we can use them to teach our neighbors, and we can help them grow their own food and grow in public places. We will earn their trust and respect.

We continue to improve ourselves and our community: eventually, even the local Detroit folks will have been /k/onverted. We will be a shining example of a largely self-sufficient city.

I must head out for the night, but I will be back in a couple days (most likely on /k/).

We need to first figure out location and taxes, I would think. Supplies will be more of a priority when we know where we're going and what sort of repairs the /k/ompound will need.

However, if you would like to stockpiling supplies as you scrounge them up:

We will need general tools and supplies for home maintenance. We will need to assess the building before getting into this list, but establishing a general workshop area would be a good idea, especially since we will need to build a few things for our gardening setup.

We will need general gardening tools and supplies. Seeping hoses, quality soil, a mulcher,... I'll see if I can get some urban homesteading books uploaded.

We will need fencing, outdoor lighting, etc.

We will need, if practical, components for a rainwater capture system. At the very least, it will keep the plants sufficiently watered, but we may be able to get drinking water out of it. These supplies can also be used to establish a greywater system.

We will need, if space permits, livestock and related supplies. A watch dog or two would be nice, and I'll see about finding that urban homesteading book in electronic format so you can read up on what types of animals lend themselves to this sort of close-quarters farming (chickens, rabbits, quail, waterfowl,...).

We will need bicycles for parts. We can cut costs and limit our oil dependence if we ride and maintain our

own bicycles. I am somewhat knowledgeable on bicycle mechanics; this is a skill I wish to sharpen when I'm done with my EMT course.

I am sure I'm overlooking something. If this is how you wish to help, begin stockpiling things that may be useful; we will arrange for shipment to the compound when the need arises.

My finances are miniscule, so I can't help you much in terms of funding, but my background can definitely benefit your efforts in a consultant role. I hold a degree in mechanical engineering, with a concentration in power plant design.

Nowhere in your document did you mention the energy needs of "New Detroit." For self-sufficient operation, you will undoubtedly need your own micro-grid for energy.

Detroit's weather data shows average double-digit wind MPH ratings, making it a prime location for wind power. Windmills will also be more difficult to sabotage at the hands of redguards than solar (which takes a well-aimed pebble throw to ruin a \$2000 panel permanently), and can be done on a big scale with scrap parts.

If you get livestock, I can also design a system based on using the cow manure's methane gas to power a gas turbine system connected to a generator, also using junkyard parts.
