- Challenge Statistics update % Project-GC:
 - Monthly Challenge Cache location update
 - 41384 active challenge caches worldwide (by attribute search) up from 40978 +406 (as of 6/3)
 - USA has 16,650 active challenge caches, followed by Germany, Canada, Norway, France
 - No change in the Challenge Leader stats Worldwide or in the USA.

TOPIC: Building Challenge Trails

What makes a good challenge trail?

"The goal of a challenge power trail should be that the cacher can find 100% of the caches and then log Found It logs for all that they qualify for. " ~Doug Macrae (RetiredGuy)

What sort of experience do you want cachers to have?

- Getting 30 park and grab challenge caches quickly and easily, or climbing trees
- Trudging through trash along the side of a busy highway or walking down a nice trail in the woods

Who is your audience?

- Starting geocachers
- Experienced cachers
- A range (different levels of the same challenge)
- There are very few 1/1 challenge caches out there
 - Nels has found 1006 challenge caches, only 1 is a 1/1, there are only 41 total in the US as of last week (0.25% of US challenge caches)

Where are they coming from?

- Local
 - o less cohesive trail
 - Multiple vehicles more likely
 - Longer trail that may take multiple days
- Travelers
 - o Easier for them if there is one cohesive trail, gaps in trail eat up time
 - Won't have local knowledge
 - Parking coords even more helpful
 - Less likely to spend multiple days on the same trail

Special tools required?

- It is probably good to avoid special tools unless you make it very clear so they can plan when traveling
- Some special tools may be difficult to travel with, i.e. ladder

Special clothing/attire required?

- Clothing is generally determined by the location/season and surroundings, but it is helpful to note of specifics for the cache location ie:
 - o Roadside floods after rain, you way want muck boots
 - Lots of stinging nettle, wear long pants/sleeves

Other things to consider to help cachers prepare:

- Are the D/T ratings correct for the hide or are they a reflection of the challenge?
 - Guidelines recommend that D be the difficulty of the challenge, Terrain based on the hide, but this is not adhered to.
- Do the coordinates need to be corrected?
 - Coords can be not as posted, but at final coords listed on page
 - Correcting all the coords is annoying busywork
- Are the cache attributes accurate?
 - Some attributes are added to help cachers meet other challenges
- Are parking coordinates provided?
- Are the cache hides a similar container?
 - Knowing what to look for can make a trail easier/faster
- Can it be accessed by foot/bike/car?
- Are there multiple points of access?
- Weather considerations (swampy area, no tree cover, etc)
- What is the terrain (steep hills, tree climbs)
- Is it a safe area for cachers?
 - Consider traffic, surroundings, lighting at night, questionable activity

How easy will it be to maintain?

- Use durable containers
- No one wants to travel and then DNF a challenge cache. Make sure the trail can be maintained
 - Some trails allow cachers to help maintain them for example, RetiredGuy created a website for the Retired Monkey Power Trail with lots of information. On that site, cachers that are going to run the entire trail can volunteer to help with the maintenance and will be sent a maintenance kit in advance.

Challenge Cache Moratorium?!!

A 1 year halt on all challenge cache publishing gave GCHQ time to rework the rules and guidelines for challenge caches. Post-moratorium challenge caches abide by different restrictions than pre-moratorium challenge caches, which have been 'grandfathered' as is.

Moratorium started: April, 2015 Moratorium ended: May 25, 2016
