What: Art+Feminism Wikipedia editathon (2014-) is an annual, global collaborative effort to redress the under representation of women, gender fluid, and POC women and genderfluid editors and artists to the global online encyclopedia.. The Art History program at UConn has been organizing and hosting a node annually since 2016: The node has largely been linked to one or more of our art history classes and held in a computer room in the library in order to facilitate community involvement. We're always looking for greater UConn community participation and collaboration with UConn Hartford and UConn Stamford! Art+Feminism offers online training for instructors/editors, provides grant monies for pizza and childcare, and backup when the inevitable "old guard" Wiki editor resistance to an addition kicks in. The edit-a-thon is held globally in and around March, which is women's history month, give or take a few weeks.

Even without significant third-party scholarship or collections, a record of significant grants and awards is a great way to demonstrate an artist is known and respected in her/their field! This is a good category to attend to and to build up in stubs or existing entries.
