PRO-BOARD

[Pro-Board](#) provides all of the accredited programs by state and/or province. It also gives a listing of the Standard, Registry Code, Level of Training, and edition used. Pro-Board provides contact information for that state including mailing address, telephone number, email address and website.

International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC)

[IFSAC](#) provides all of the accredited programs by state and/or province. It also gives a listing of the Discipline, Level, Standard, Edition, Method, and Date. IFSAC provides the name of the certifying agency for that state.

The certifying entity may award reciprocity based on the certifying agency that delivered the initial course of instruction. There are no clearly defined lines that allow an individual to cross state borders. In Firefighting there is one clear definition and it refers to the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ). The AHJ may be a Federal, State, County, Municipal, or Fire District. The AHJ may accept or reject any part or the entire certification. This also applies within the border of the State. Large municipalities often require a re-take of the entire course or may not recognize training not taken or delivered by their own staff.
