Welcome back to another exciting new school year! I am very excited to be in another year of teaching 7th grade and look forward to a wonderful year. I will be teaching World History throughout the year. This includes Ancient Greece, Ancient Rome, Byzantine and Muslim Empire, Asian empire and the Renaissance and Reformation. The students <u>do</u> need a folder for learning this year. The folders are utilized when I send things home either for you to see or for them to study. We will also utilize google docs/polaris for much of our everyday work.

I am a huge advocate of reading and writing throughout the content areas, so much of our time is spent collaborating and engaging through reading, writing, and critical thinking through global questioning.

We will also be using schoology/polaris. We will be utilizing much of our inquiry and higher thinking skills to create and work on problem based learning projects throughout the year.

- Bonus or extra credit points

Grading is done in two ways: process and product grades. Product grades count toward 85 % of your grade while process grades count toward 15% of your grade. Product grades will include such things as tests, quizzes, and long-term projects while process grades are such things as homework, in-class activities, etc. I encourage students to be engaged and ask as many questions as they need.

Late Assignments:

- 1. Students are encouraged to complete and turn in their work on time
- 2.Students may turn in late work, however, every day an assignment is late 10% of their earned grade will be automatically deleted.
- 3.After 10 school days, the assignment will no longer be accepted as it will not be worth credit

I DO ALLOW REVISION/RETAKE TO TAKE PLACE. TESTS AND QUIZZES WILL BE TAKEN THROUGH POLARIS. ALL STUDENTS WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO RETAKE TESTS; THE AVERAGE OF THE TWO SCORES WILL BE ENTERED IN THE GRADEBOOK. THE SECOND ATTEMPT MUST BE TAKEN WITHIN 5 SCHOOL DAYS.

We will continue to use Polaris/Schoology that is constantly updated with news, tests/quizzes dates, and classroom materials. *I do not pass out textbooks but often use articles, my own text to create discussion!* Polaris is a great source of information and I highly recommend using it to keep updated with what we are doing in class. This is where classroom materials will be utilized throughout the nine weeks.

Absent Policy:

When your child is absent from my class, it is **their responsibility** to find out what they missed by following the absent procedures. They have the same number of days to complete the assignments as days they were absent. **Students with an unexcused absence will receive a o in the grade book for assessments or work missed during that class period.**

We will also use project based learning to make real world connections and continue to use technology.
