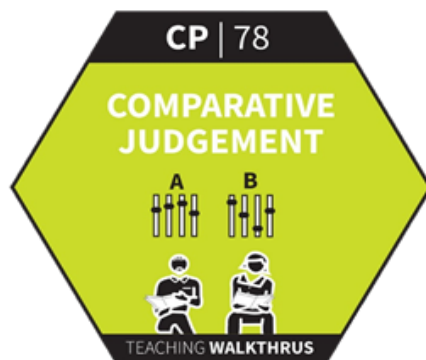

Comparative judgement is based on an iterative series of comparisons of pairs of student work. The process results in a collective professional consensus of a group of assessors with high reliability. CJ can be used for multiple purposes in education: peer feedback, developing teachers' assessment competences, moderation of standards, grading, formative feedback. This walkthru provides an overview of how it can be applied. Even though CJ has limitations there appears to be significant potential to support learning.
