Skills	- Solve the parts of a math problem inside parentheses before moving to the rest of the expression. - Understand that a fraction is another way to show a division problem, where the numerator is divided by the denominator. - Describe mathematical relationships using either words or symbols.	- Identify when and how to use specific formulas to calculate measurements like perimeter, area, and volume. - Use tables and reference charts to change measurements from one unit to another (such as inches to feet or grams to kilograms). - Group triangles into categories based on the lengths of their sides or the size of their angles. - Sort four-sided shapes into specific groups based on their unique features, such as parallel lines or right angles.	- Create a grid and label its key parts, such as the x-axis, y-axis, and the origin (0,0). - Plot points on a grid by moving along the horizontal and vertical axes to specific coordinates. - Transfer information accurately between a graph and a table to show numerical patterns in different formats. - Determine if a set of numbers follows an additive rule (adding a constant) or a multiplicative rule (multiplying by a constant).	- Organize information into various formats, such as scatter plots, bar graphs, and dot plots, to show patterns clearly. - Examine graphs to draw conclusions and solve math problems based on the displayed information. - Use whole numbers, decimals, and fractions from frequency tables, dot plots, or stem-and-leaf plots to solve one- and two-step problems.
