Absences

Attendance at rehearsals and performances is mandatory for all student performers. The only exceptions are sudden personal illness (verified by a parent or doctor), medical or family emergency (verified by a parent or doctor), or religious obligations. Academic Eligibility

The school is monitoring academic eligibility for both athletic teams and the marching band. Please review your grades and make sure you are passing all of your classes. It is your responsibility to remain in good academic standing. Every Friday, administrators will run a grade report. Students who are failing two or more classes will be ineligible to participate in marching band activities for the entire following week - even if you get your grades back up in the middle of the week! If you are ineligible, Mr. Siegel will notify you in person and send a follow-up email to both you and your parents.

Rehearsals this Week

- 1. Tuesday 9/30 = 6:00-9:00 PM
 - a. The first half of rehearsal is split sectionals. Winds will spend some time working on Homecoming Music (see below) and the rest learning the final choreography for Part 3 of the show. Percussion and Guard have plenty of work to do refining parts of the show.

b. The second half of rehearsal will be an ensemble visual rehearsal where we will clean dots in Segment D and E.

2. Thursday 10/2 = 6:00-9:00 PM

- a. This rehearsal is all about beginnings, endings, transitions, and IMPACT points. Bring your best effort and let's really tackle these important aspects of the performance.
- b. The final 20 minutes will be spent reviewing the homecoming halftime routine

Homecoming Music - Wind Band

Woodwinds and Brass should make sure they have a copy of "Jupiter Hymn" in their flip books. If you need a copy, you can get it from Schoology, or ask a music librarian. Please practice this in advance of Tuesday's rehearsal so things can run more smoothly. Thanks!

- o Do not leave class early. You will have plenty of time to get ready.
- Students who have 7th period study hall or seniors with early release may come to the band room early.
- Bring all personal belongings to the band room. I will lock them inside during the pep rally and you can get them back after.
- Bring hearing protection (ear plugs) because the Arena Gym is really loud!
- Wear your MTMB shirt!
- Be sure to have your flip book, etc. to play tunes like at a football game.
- At the end of the pep rally, return instruments to the band room.
