
Book Review: <u>Lyfe: Elektra's Revenge. Book 1</u>. By Ann Sterzinger. February 3, 2018. 218 pages.

Lyfe is a science fiction story written by Ushanka comrade and emerging author Ann Sterzinger.

It is a story of Elektra, a young girl living on the moon of Earth II. You'll learn that the original Earth was destroyed when mankind 'nuked itself stupid' and the human race had to move to Earth II. Elektra is special because her grandfather was the first human, mortal, to be allowed to live on the moon with the other species, a higher class, called the immortals. Yes, they are immortal, but they die too from suicide and murder. Three mortal generations in, and Elektra's specialness has worn off.

Elektra has a crap job, horrible family, lives hand to mouth, is addicted like everyone else, and is heartbroken. Earth II's moon is overpopulated, run by a secret government that kills mortals who violate the laws and may be brainwashing the masses into homosexuality, and has a population that has slipped backward in a Idiocracy sort of way. This is the canvas for Sterzinger's creative storytelling skills, and you will not be disappointed.

Sterzinger is an excellent writer and a master of language. You won't find a typo or poorly written sentence in this book. On one hand, the story is well written and reads fast. On the other hand, the details of the story will keep you from reading too fast.
