### **Guest Poet – Sheryl Anderson**

Sheryl is a writer and drama facilitator providing opportunities for people to tell their stories through poetry and performance. Sheryl has been writing and performing poetry for many years. With one published collection of poetry – cannibal love, Sheryl is working on her next. She lives in Rainbow Beach and runs creative writing workshops for aspiring writers. Sheryl tries to believe in at least five impossible things before breakfast.

### **Slam Rules**

- 1. Maximum of 3 minutes long points deducted for every 10 second increment over 3 mins
- 2. Time starts from their first word
- 3. Must be original work
- 4. No music or props
- 5. No hate speech, sexism, racism, queerphobia content etc: as described in the following definitions:

#### **Slam Definitions:**

- Hate speech: abusive or threatening speech or writing that expresses prejudice on the basis
  of ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or similar grounds.
- Racism: prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism by an individual, community, or institution
  against a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic
  group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. Respect must be shown to First
  Nations People
- Sexism: prejudice or discrimination based on sex or gender, especially against women and girls.
- Queerphobia: describes the hatred, prejudice or discrimination directed towards members
  of the LGBTQIA+ community. Queerphobia includes homophobia, biphobia, transphobia, and
  all other forms of hate towards LGBTQIA+ identities.





We realise Spoken Word Poetry is space for free expression and often contains adult content
and triggers so have advertised the Heat and Final as suitable for an 18+year age group.
 Please note we cannot fully control who will hear the content as it is a semi-open space.
