## **Course Description**

Ancient History explores the foundations of world civilizations from prehistory through the fall of the Western Roman Empire. Aligned to the Tennessee State Standards, this course uses a variety of lenses—social, political, economic, cultural, technological, historical, and geographic—to investigate major civilizations including Mesopotamia, Egypt, the Indus Valley, China, Greece, Rome, and more. Students will use primary and secondary sources to analyze historical events and trends and will complete a Capstone Project that synthesizes their learning.

## **Student Progress, Assessment, and Grading**

Grading will be based on a weighted category system to ensure a well-rounded evaluation of each student's performance.

### **Category Weights:**

- 60% – Quizzes, Projects, Writing Assignments, Classwork, Homework
- 40% – Exams (Unit Tests & Final Exam)
- Capstone Project – A required final project that demonstrates students' understanding of ancient civilizations and historical thinking skills.
- Rubrics – All major written assignments and projects will be assessed using clear rubrics provided in advance.
