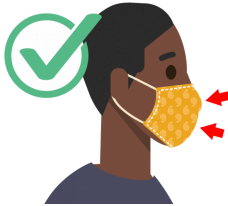
HIGHLIGHTS FROM PREVIOUS MESSAGING

Have two or more layers of washable (or disposable), breathable fabric

- **USDA Waiver for Food Services:** The USDA has extended the waiver that allows ALL Students to receive free meals through the 2021-2022 school year. This waiver, set to expire on June 30, 2022, allows all students to have a no charge breakfast and lunch at school each day as long as they choose a fruit or vegetable with their meals. These meals are provided free of charge as part of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act of 2020, USDA Food & Nutrition Service waiver. - Our process for being hired as a substitute teacher in our district consists of the following:
 - Completed employment application
 - Interviewing with one of our administrators
 - Reference checks conducted
 - Once you have been approved to substitute, we will then have you complete the following:
 - Criminal Background Check
 - Completion of W-4 Employee Withholding Certificate, I-9 Employment Eligibility Verification form
 - Direct Deposit Form
 - Substitute availability form
