

Review of OER Referatories and Repositories:

[College of the Canyons Open Textbooks](#)

This site serves as the College of the Canyons' own OER textbook repository. They have OER textbooks available for several different disciplines of varied natures. While the overall breadth isn't huge, I found it quite impressive since these resources all seem to be created by the College of the Canyons and their faculty. The repository seems geared towards students, but could be used by faculty as well, and is clearly labeled by course discipline and number (e.g. English 101). There does not seem to be a search function, but the texts are grouped by discipline, and the various disciplines are linked near the top of the page as well. It is easy to navigate considering the size of the repository in its current state.

In addition to the repository page itself, there are additional resources including:

- A page where students can search for course sections utilizing OER texts
- A resources page and two forms for faculty to help faculty learn about, create, and/or adopt OER texts
- A '[More Resources](#)' page with a ton of links to anything and everything OER related. This would be a good one to bookmark!
- Pages with information on various OER related conferences and events that the College of the Canyons has been involved with.

Given that this repository is geared towards OERs created in-house, it is not a vast resource compared to many others, but I found it inspiring in its current state, and the linked pages serve as great resources to learn about and connect with many other OER repositories and resources.
