Background (11pt, bold)

The author(s) must convey the background of research clearly and show the focus and the problem which is research. Background should mention the purpose of article review. The author(s) must also clearly show the novelty (state the art) of this research.

The manuscript is typed in Microsoft Word in Book Antiqua font, size 11 points, with 1.15 spaces, top, right and bottom margins 2,5 and left margin 1,9, printed on A4 paper with a minimum of 3000 words (8 pages) and a maximum of 5000 words (15 pages). Articles written in Indonesian or English. However, if the manuscript is sent for publication, the author(s) will ask to translate the manuscript in English according to the rules of the academic language.

Literature Review

Convey the literature review as comprehensive study and interpretation of literature that addresses a specific topic. The theoretical approach(es) used in topic or question on background, to identify, appraise and synthesize evidence in order to answer specific research questions.



Method

Convey the method clearly, not long-winded and comprehensive. In short, the writer must be able to explain how this research is done, how the data was analyzed and so on.

Result and Discussion

Convey the findings comprehensively with proper and directed analysis. References use a referral technique with the APA system (name, year). The inclusion of indirect references should be accompanied by information about the page number where the citation comes from. Example: (Held, 2004). Highly recommended the author(s) using reference management such as mendeley, zotero, etc.
