1. Roma 2:3 (NIV) So when you, a mere man, pass judgment on them and yet do the same things, do you think you will escape God's judgment? =Rhetorical
2. Roma 2:4 (NIV) Or do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, tolerance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness leads you toward repentance? = Rhetorical
3. Roma 2:21 (NIV) you, then, who teach others, do you not teach yourself? 1=Rhetorical
4. Roma 2:21 You who preach against stealing, do you steal? 2= Rhetorical
5. Roma 2:22 (NIV) You who say that people should not commit adultery, do you commit adultery? 1= Rhetorical
6. Roma 2:22 You who abhor idols, do you rob temples? 2= Rhetorical
7. Roma 2:23 (NIV) You who brag about the law, do you dishonor God by breaking the law? = Rhetorical

12. Roma 3:7 (NIV) Someone might argue, "If my falsehood enhances God's truthfulness and so increases his glory, why am I still condemned as a sinner?" =Rhetorical
13. Roma 3:9 (NIV) What shall we conclude then?
14. Roma 3:9 Are we any better? Not at all! We have already made the charge that Jews and Gentiles alike are all under sin. 1= Rhetorical
15. Roma 3:9 (NIV) What shall we conclude then?
16. Are we any better? Not at all! We have already made the charge that Jews and Gentiles alike are all under sin. 2= Not at all!
17. Roma 3:27 (NIV) Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded.
18. Roma 3:27 On what principle?
19. Roma 3:27 On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith.
20. Roma 3:29 (NIV) Is God the God of Jews only?
21. Roma 3:29 Is he not the God of Gentiles too? Yes, of Gentiles too,
22. Roma 3:31 (NIV) Do we, then, nullify the law by this faith? Not at all! Rather, we uphold the law.
23. Roma 4:1 (NIV) What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather, discovered in this matter?
24. Roma 4:3 (NIV) What does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness."
25. Roma 4:9 (NIV) Is this blessedness only for the circumcised, or also for the uncircumcised? We have been saying that Abraham's faith was credited to him as righteousness.
26. Roma 4:10 (NIV) Under what circumstances was it credited?
27. Roma 4:10 Was it after he was circumcised, or before? It was not after, but before!
28. Roma 6:1 (NIV) What shall we say, then?

29. Roma 6:1 Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?
30. Roma 6:2 (NIV) By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?
31. Roma 6:3 (NIV) Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?
32. Roma 6:15 (NIV) What then?
33. Roma 6:15 Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means!
34. Roma 6:16 (NIV) Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone to obey him as slaves, you are slaves to the one whom you obey--whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness?
35. Roma 6:21 (NIV) What benefit did you reap at that time from the things you are now ashamed of? Those things result in death!
36. Roma 7:1 (NIV) Do you not know, brothers--for I am speaking to men who know the law--that the law has authority over a man only as long as he lives?
37. Roma 7:7 (NIV) What shall we say, then? Is the law sin? Certainly not! Indeed I would not have known what sin was except through the law. For I would not have known what coveting really was if the law had not said, "Do not covet."
38. Roma 7:13 (NIV) Did that which is good, then, become death to me? By no means! But in order that sin might be recognized as sin, it produced death in me through what was good, so that through the commandment sin might become utterly sinful.
39. Roma 7:24 (NIV) What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death?
40. Roma 8:24 (NIV) For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what he already has?
41. Roma 8:31 (NIV) What, then, shall we say in response to this?
42. Roma 8:32 If God is for us, who can be against us?
43. Roma 8:32 (NIV) He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all--how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?
44. Roma 8:33 (NIV) Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies.
45. Roma 8:34 (NIV) Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus, who died--more than that, who was raised to life--is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.
46. Roma 8:35 (NIV) Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or

hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?

47. Roma 9:14 (NIV) What then shall we say? Is God unjust? Not at all!

48. Roma 9:19 (NIV) One of you will say to me: "Then why does God still blame us?

49. Roma 9:19 For who resists his will?"

50. Roma 9:20 (NIV) But who are you, O man, to talk back to God?

51. Roma 9:20 "Shall what is formed say to him who formed it, 'Why did you make me like this?'"

52. Roma 9:21 (NIV) Does not the potter have the right to make out of the same lump of clay some pottery for noble purposes and some for common use?

53. Roma 9:22 (NIV) What if God, choosing to show his wrath and make his power known, bore with great patience the objects of his wrath--prepared for destruction?

54. Roma 9:24 (NIV) even us, whom he also called, not only from the Jews but also from the Gentiles?

55. Roma 9:30 (NIV) What then shall we say? That the Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness, have obtained it, a righteousness that is by faith;

56. Roma 9:32 (NIV) Why not? Because they pursued it not by faith but as if it were by works. They stumbled over the "stumbling stone."

57. Roma 10:6 (NIV) But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down)

58. Roma 10:7 (NIV) "or 'Who will descend into the deep?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead).

59. Roma 10:8 (NIV) But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith we are proclaiming:

60. Roma 10:14 (NIV) How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in?

61. Roma 10:14 And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard?

62. Roma 10:14 And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?

63. Roma 10:15 (NIV) And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

64. Roma 10:16 (NIV) But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?"

65. Roma 10:18 (NIV) But I ask: Did they not hear? Of course they did: "Their voice has gone out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world."

66. Roma 10:19 (NIV) Again I ask: Did Israel not understand? First, Moses says, "I will make you envious by those who are not a nation; I will make you angry by a nation that has no understanding."
67. Roma 11:1 (NIV) I ask then: Did God reject his people? By no means! I am an Israelite myself, a descendant of Abraham, from the tribe of Benjamin.
68. Roma 11:3 (NIV) "Lord, they have killed your prophets and torn down your altars; I am the only one left, and they are trying to kill me?"
69. Roma 11:4 (NIV) And what was God's answer to him? "I have reserved for myself seven thousand who have not bowed the knee to Baal."
70. Roma 11:7 (NIV) What then? What Israel sought so earnestly it did not obtain, but the elect did. The others were hardened,
71. Roma 11:11 (NIV) Again I ask: Did they stumble so as to fall beyond recovery? Not at all! Rather, because of their transgression, salvation has come to the Gentiles to make Israel envious.
72. Roma 11:15 (NIV) For if their rejection is the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance be but life from the dead?
73. Roma 11:34 (NIV) "Who has known the mind of the Lord?
74. Roma 11:34 Or who has been his counselor?"
75. Roma 11:35 (NIV) "Who has ever given to God, that God should repay him?"
76. Roma 13:3 (NIV) For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and he will commend you.
77. Roma 14:4 (NIV) Who are you to judge someone else's servant? To his own master he stands or falls. And he will stand, for the Lord is able to make him stand.
78. Roma 14:10 (NIV) You, then, why do you judge your brother?
79. Roma 14:10 Or why do you look down on your brother? For we will all stand before God's judgment seat. 1=
