Group discussion

- Zoom fatigue
 - people enjoy talking by phone
 - Getting reticent people to participate via breakout rooms
 - Mixed feelings about keeping cameras on to promote engagement
 - Adjusting the length of meetings
 - Hopeful for changing work patterns in the future

Pandemic

- Some libraries are closing for in person service again
- Changing thoughts around equipment that needs to be provided to staff
 - Stipends for phone, supplies, etc
 - Types of device, furniture, etc.
- What happens to work from home staff when the power goes out due to weather/natural disasters
- Getting back to work
 - Various stages of reopening
 - Project management logistics around people- planning ahead for distancing, cohort models
 - Balancing backlogs of work between what needs to be done on campus versus at home, especially with impending shutdowns
- Working remotely
 - Many people had plenty of work to do from home
 - Many people were asked to spin up projects for other people, training "volunteers" takes work
 - Was nice to get some documentation and interest in some projects
 - Challenges around getting buy in for easy to spin-up projects, challenges around setting up clear roles in project participation
 - Having agreements that work can be provided to other departments, but that the supervision needs to come from those departments
- Facilitating meetings
 - Challenges around promoting even engagement
 - Knowing when people are ready to start talking, move on to another agenda item
 - Positives around Zoom meetings- no scheduling conference rooms, shorter meetings, large meetings can engage more people via chat
