#### **About Our School**

Holy Family RC Primary School is situated on Summerhill Terrace in Aberdeen. Holy Family serves the Summerhill area of Aberdeen City. The school roll is currently 172 pupils with an Early Learning Centre class of 20 pupils. Holy Family has cycle/scooter racks situated at the front of the school by the school office. There are lots of fantastic walking and cycling routes to our school which we would like to encourage more people to use.

## What is a travel plan?

A travel plan is a document which encourages people to travel to our school in an eco-friendly, healthy and safe way. This travel plan supports walking and cycling as the most eco-friendly, active and safe way to travel to our school.

There are many benefits of walking and cycling to school:

- <u>Safety:</u> More people cycling and walking to school means less cars on the road and around the school gate making it a much safer environment for everyone.
- <u>Eco-Friendly:</u> By walking or cycling to school we are helping the environment and improving the air quality around our school.
- Health & Fitness: The recommendation is that all children undertake 2 hours of Physical activity 5 days a week but many children in Scotland do not achieve this. If you walk or cycle to school, it is a good way for everyone in the family to get exercise and provide health benefits for the whole family.

## Issues highlighted in our recent Travel Audit include:

1.	60 % agreed there were concerns about traffic around Holy Family
2.	40% said it was safe and pleasant to walk to school
	20% said it was safe enough

## **Our Travel Data**

Each year, Holy Family conducts a travel survey. The results are in the table below which includes walking, cycling and scooting. These levels have seen a slight increase since 2018 for those walking to school and over the last four years have begun to steady out. There has been a slight increase in driving levels from 2021 to 2023.

## Tips to keep you safe when WALKING to school:

- Plan your route to school first. Discuss this with an adult. There are many paths within the area with crossing facilities – pelican and a patroller on Stronsay. Make use of these and plan a safe route. Stick to the route you know.
- Follow the Green Cross Code Green cross code (roadwise.co.uk)
- Find a good place to cross, this should be away from parked cars and have good visibility in both directions.
- Be bright and be seen, the more you stand out the more drivers will see you and slow down
- Remember to ALWAYS look LEFT and RIGHT when crossing the road.
- Be careful of driveways and narrow entrances.
- Stay alert and pay attention at all times.
- Use the clearly marked path to walk into the playground.

#### Tips to keep you safe when CYCLING and SCOOTING to school:

Where children can do so safely, we actively encourage children to bike or scoot to school. Please feel free to bring your bike or scooter and make use of our bike and scooter shelters. The school cannot take any responsibility for any bikes or scooters left here so you will need to bring a lock.

- Plan your route to and from school with an adult first.
- Wear a helmet and wear something bright.
- Ride in a position you can see and be seen.
- No cycling or scooting in the playground between 8.30am and 9am and between 3pm and 3.30pm.
- Consider other pedestrians around the school gate. Use your bell if necessary to warn others that you are there.
- Maintain your bike. Check your brakes and tyre pressure. Guides can be found online by Cycling Scotland.
- Use the clearly marked path to walk into the playground. Push your bike or scooter along with you.

## If you are taking the CAR

- Plan and give yourself plenty of time to account for any unexpected delays, please give yourself time to find a responsible place to park.
- Park and stride parking 5 or 10 minutes away from the school will help in tackling congestion.
- Use Fernielea Gospel Hall car park to park safely to reduce congestion
- Keep your speeds low.
- Always let your child out on the pavement side.
- Do not park on yellow lines/Zig zag lines or other parking restrictions or in front of people's driveways.
- Do not do a turn in the road on Summerhill Drive
- Check for other road users before you or your child open the car door.
- Set a good example by teaching your child about road safety.
- Be COURTEOUS to other drivers and road users
- Remember Summerhill Terrace is a main bus route do not park in the bus bay
- Use the clearly marked paths for children to walk safely into the playground.
