A busy week in music for students and staff!

Premises Studios delivered a very successful 'Voice Jam' workshop with our Chamber Choir today. The students learnt an R 'n' B version of the classic song 'Let It Be'. Students had opportunities to sing solo parts and rap, too! Well done, Chamber Choir!

Music Technology Club runs on Wednesday and Friday lunchtimes. 30 students have explored music apps on their mobile phones and the Google Chromebooks, creating music with this technology. This week, we explored our mini recording studio, recording vocal tracks on Garageband and learning about types of microphones and how they work. 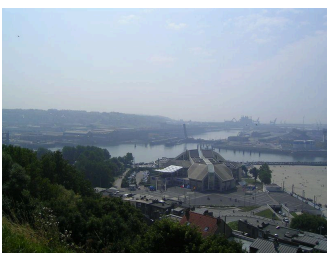
Stromae

Science News

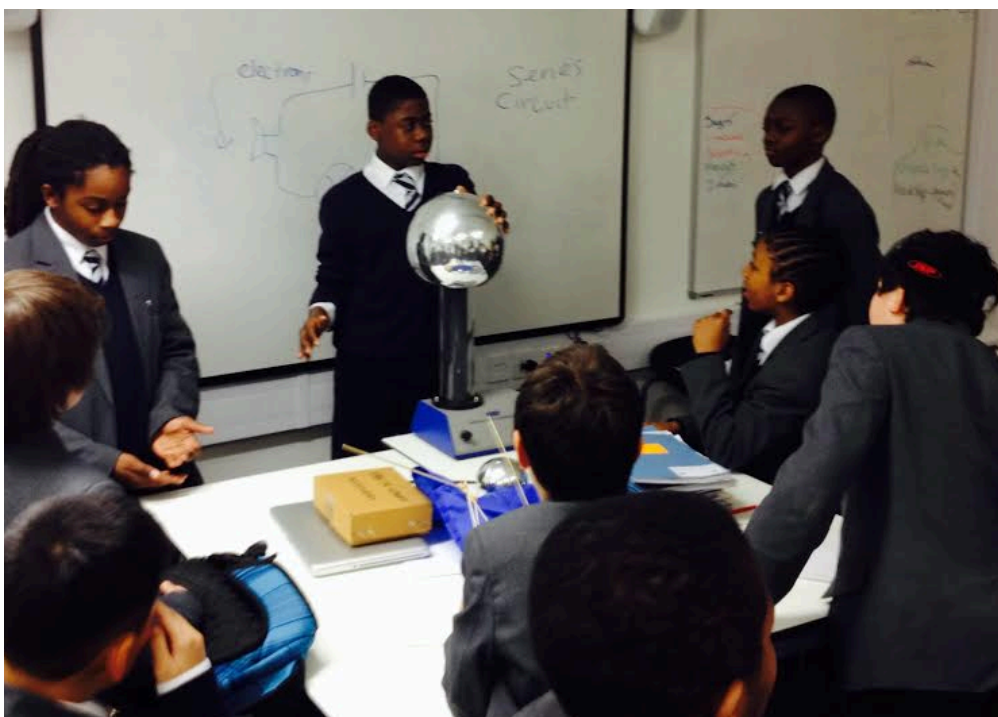
This week students learned about vaccinations in Biology. They used their knowledge of white blood cells learned last week to understand how the body can be protected against horrible diseases such as Polio. One of the highlights of the week was Stefan Shaw-Bailey (7MJ) saying “Thank you Edward Jenner” at the end of a rather gruesome video they watched about Smallpox. You’ll have to ask your children to see if they can tell you what he has to do with Smallpox and if they can tell you how vaccines work. Next week we will

be playing a game where we look at how diseases spread in a population.

In Chemistry students carried out a practical on neutralisation, in preparation for studying the uses of cancelling out acids or alkalis. Next week we will be using indigestion tablets in our experiments.

In Physics students have been building various circuits. A special mention goes to Tyreac Jones (7EW) for his interest in the motor and Kristina Kraszewska (7MJ) for her excellent explanation of how components affect each other. I must also praise several students for their teamwork, thoroughness and practical skills this week, I definitely have a few future Scientists here at HNS. Special mention must go to 7SD for their practical work, particularly Thyreek Williams, Benjamin Olandi-Harvey, Tibor Thursfield, Alex Tissier, Shaw-Tae Shaw-Bailey, Danielka Elliott and Emily-Rose Smith.

Just to round off the week in style, the Friday Science enrichment group received a 'shocking' finish to the week. We discussed electrons, static electricity and insulators while having good fun with the Van der Graaf generator. Pictured here is Tashan Smith-Harley (7MJ) about to shock Elijah Smith (7JH), who is preparing himself for what is to come. I would add that the students involved volunteered. A nice light-hearted finish to the week.
