This month in:

<u>MATH:</u> We will be working on PROBABILITY using organized lists, tree diagrams, and multiplication to determine possible outcomes. We will also describe the probability of an event (the likelihood that it will occur) and test some experimental probability. Then, we will finish up the year learning about integers.

SOCIAL STUDIES: We will begin looking at the young republic of the United States of America. We will learn about how the Louisiana Purchase helped the U.S. to grow; Lewis and Clark's Expedition West; effects of westward expansion on the Native Americans; the War of 1812; the Battle of the Alamo; and The Oregon Trail to name a few! Then , we will begin to study about The Civil War. We will also be participating in Junior Achievement (JA BizTown).

READING/ELA: We will be reading "A Family Apart" during the month of May. This novel is the first in a series following the adventures of six children who were sent west on the Orphan Train in the 1800s. It has many themes relevant to today, including: personal convictions, discrimination, making choices, and responsibility. After that, as time permits, we will take a look at American Tall Tales and Fairy Tales.

SCIENCE/HEALTH: We will be reading about Foods for Good Nutrition and Health and how to make wise consumer choices.
