

Instructor Guide

The *Learning with AI* module was created to support students as they navigate a rapidly changing educational landscape, one where generative AI tools are part of everyday learning, and thoughtful use is more important than ever. This module helps students reflect on how learning works, consider when AI enhances learning and when it might get in the way, and explore ethical, discipline-specific, and instructor-specific expectations around AI use.

This job aid is designed to help you confidently and clearly integrate the *Learning with AI* module into your course. Whether you're assigning it as a first-week resource, building it into your academic integrity strategy, or using it to spark class discussion, this guide offers options that are flexible, student-centered, and aligned with UNLV's AI Framework.

In this guide you will find helpful tips and ideas on how to assign and accept the Learning with Al digital badge.

How to find the Learning with AI course















Log into your Canvas account and locate the global navigation menu on the left side of your screen. Click on the Student Resources button. Towards the top of the page there is a red box with a link to the Learning with Al Microcredential. The course utilizes a self-enrollment process. You and your students can self-enroll via this URL:

https://univ.instructure.com/enroll/3YH3FX. Please note that students must self-enroll in order to take the quizzes to earn the badge.

As a quick overview, the course has seven modules with quizzes that serve as a check for understanding. By the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Describe the fundamental components of how learning works
- 2. Compare and contrast when generative AI helps learning and when it hinders learning
- 3. Find and interpret individual course policies on generative AI use
- 4. Cite AI generated content
- 5. Articulate the ethical issues of learning with generative Al



- 6. Explore helpful strategies for using generative AI to learn
- 7. Create a personal policy for using generative AI to learn

How to accept a badge for credit in your course

A: LOGIN INTO WEBCAMPUS

Login to WebCampus (a.k.a. Canvas) and click on your course in the DASHBOARD

B: IMPORT A TEMPLATE


1. Open the Canvas Commons.

From your Canvas DASHBOARD, click on COMMONS in the Global Navigation column on the left side of the screen.



2. Locate the item you would like to import.

In the search bar, type UNLV Learning with AI





3. Open the template you are interested in using.

To open the template, click the title (in light blue) or use these links:

<u>UNLV Learning with AI Assignment Template</u>


4. Import the template into your course.

Click on Import/Download on the right side of the screen.



5. Select your course.

You can import the template into all your courses or just one. After you have made your selection, click on the Import into Course button.



You will see a message that the import has started:

You have successfully started the import! It may take a little while to see changes in your course.



6. Go back to your course.

Click on the DASHBOARD icon and select the course you'll be using the template in.



C: PLACE THE TEMPLATE

Click on the ASSIGNMENTS area of the course and scroll down to IMPORTED ASSIGNMENTS.



Click on the template you imported to edit it to fit your needs (e.g., adjust the points, add your personal voice to the instructions).
