Literature Terms

GENRE	a type or category <of literature>
PROSE	ordinary written; mainly sentences and paragraphs; two main forms of prose are fiction and nonfiction
SHORT STORY	a brief work of fiction which offers a sequence of events or plot
THEME	central message or purpose of the <i>literary work</i> (novel, drama or poem); it reveals a message about people or life, which the reader can apply to his/her own experiences
CONFLICT	a struggle between two opposing forces; <i>man verses self; man verses man; man verses nature</i>
FICTION	made-up stories (FAKE!!)
NONFICTION	writing based on facts; about someone or something that is real/true (NOT FAKE!!)
CHARACTERS	fictional work includes made-up people and animals
PLOT	a series of events; the order in which a story is written or told
SETTING	a place in time, history and location, which may or may not be real
NARRATOR	the speaker in fictional writing
POINT OF VIEW	the certain perspective the story or information is written or told; first person or third person

FIRST PERSON	the perspective of a character in the story (the speaker uses <i>I, me, us, we, myself, our</i>)
THIRD PERSON	the perspective of a narrator outside the story
TRAITS	the quality that make each character (and person) unique
CHARACTERIZATION	the creation and development of a character; the author can be direct; through dialogue or actions of the specific character or indirect; through the thoughts and observations of other characters in regards to a specific character
EXPOSITION	the beginning of a story (introduces characters and setting)
RISING ACTION	series of events that builds up tension and suspense (where the plot thickens!)
CLIMAX	point of greatest tension... the turning point of the story
FALLING ACTION	after the climax, where everything "falls into place" and leads to the resolution
RESOLUTION	where the conflict is resolved (end of story)
