Basic Project Plan

Project Title: EP Recording Project

Project Duration: 12 weeks

Project Objective: To record a high-quality EP with the artist/multiple artists.

Week 1-2: Pre-production

Define Project Scope, Objectives, and Timeframe: In this phase, I'll have detailed discussions with the artist(s) to understand their artistic vision, the number of songs to be recorded, any specific technical requirements, and the overall project. Week 3-8: Recording

Begin Recording Sessions: Set up recording sessions in the studio and begin capturing instrumentals and vocals for the selected tracks. Paying close attention to technical details such as mic placement, signal routing, and room acoustics to ensure high-quality recordings.

Track Instrumentals and Vocals: I will work closely with the artist(s) to capture their performances authentically and emotively. Provide guidance and support as needed to help them deliver their best performances while maintaining a comfortable and creative atmosphere in the studio.

Encourage Experimentation: Explore different sonic textures, instrumentation, and arrangement ideas to enhance the musicality and dynamics of each song. I shall try and aid creativity while staying true to the artist(s)' vision for the project.

Collaborate closely to incorporate their feedback and creative vision and preferences into the mix while offering your expertise and guidance to ensure a polished and professional result.

Review and Refinement: Listen critically to the initial mixes and identify areas for improvement. Make adjustments to levels, EQ, and processing as needed to address any issues and refine the mix to meet the project's quality standards, using similar reference tracks to aid with sonic cohesion with other tracks in a similar vein.

Finalise Mixes: Once the mixes meet the artist(s)' and stakeholders approval and align with the project's goals, bounce them down ready for mastering. Prepare consolidated files and documentation to facilitate the mastering process and ensure a smooth transition to the next phase.

Week 11-12: Mastering and Finalization

Mastering Sessions: Transfer final mixes to a new DAW project for mastering and begin the mastering process. Apply subtle equalisation, compression, and other processing techniques to optimise the overall sound and ensure consistency across all tracks, using reference tracks to ensure cohesiveness within genre and style.

Coordinate with Artist(s): Address any concerns or preferences they may have regarding the final sound and delivery format of the EP. Ask if they have any specific reference tracks in mind.

Final Quality Checks: Conduct thorough quality checks to ensure that all tracks meet the project's technical specifications and sonic standards. Listen to the mastered tracks in various playback systems and environments to identify any potential issues and make final adjustments as needed.

Prepare for Hand-in: Make sure all processes have been documented and writing is clear and concise. Make sure all interactions with stakeholders is shown and that all documentation is representative of the project. Format all tracks ready for submission

By following this detailed project plan and maintaining open communication and collaboration with the artist(s), I can ensure a smooth and successful recording process that results in a high-quality EP that resonates with listeners and showcases the artist(s)' talent and creativity.

Team and leadership development

I feel that all of these elements, and incorporating previous learning and experience, will help me and the artist(s) further develop and result in a cohesive, well-made, meticulously polished project in every aspect, from the documentation to the performances to the production.
